PDC-EXECOM RESOLUTION NO. 44-2017

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE PROPOSED RECLUSTERING OF MUNICIPALITIES FOR THE SUSTAINABLE BULK WATER SUPPLY DEVELOPMENT IN THE PROVINCE OF BOHOL

WHEREAS, the proposed reclustering of municipalities takes into account the two (2) water studies conducted for Bohol Province: The Feasibility Study for Bulk Water Supply under the Bohol Water and Sanitation Project of USAID COMPETE for the Western Bohol covering Tagbilaran City and the 17 municipalities of the province namely: Alburquerque, Antequera, Baclayon, Balilihan, Catigbian, Corella, Cortes, Daus, Lila, Loboc, Loon, Maribojoc, Panglao, San Isidro, Sevilla and Sikatuna and the Bohol Integrated Water Supply System Master Plan under the Local Governance Development Program AusAID covering the entire municipalities of the province;

WHEREAS, the reclustering of municipalities is necessary to fast track the implementation of the Bulk Water Supply throughout the Province especially in areas where water is very much needed to support socio-economic development, reduce long-term investment cost for development of water facilities and to provide water supply most economical for consumers;

WHEREAS, the Provincial Government has recommended different clusters with proposed identified water sources and other potential surface water sources within the cluster based on the 2 studies conducted;

WHEREAS, these clusters will become one of the basis for the development of bulk water supply in the province, particularly in the development of surface water as a sustainable source of bulk water supply for all municipalities and city in

the province. The clusters may also be used as guide in the supply and procurement of water, which local government units/ local water districts and the private sector may participate with the general parameters of procurement set by the Provincial Government of Bohol to ensure reliable and affordable water supply;

WHEREAS, after being presented with the proposed cluster of municipalities to be covered by bulk water supply, with the attached map and listing of Municipalities per cluster made an integral part of this Resolution, this Body has found that said clusters are necessary to guide future development of bulk water supply, which is viable considering the scope and coverage of these clusters;

WHEREAS, this Body has further recognized that the clustering of municipalities for bulk water supply is aligned with the development framework of the Province of Bohol, fostering further socio-economic growth especially in areas where water supply is limited;

WHEREFORE, upon proper motion duly seconded, be it resolved by this Body in a meeting duly convened -


To adopt the proposed Reclustering of municipalities for the Sustainable Bulk Water Supply Development in the Province of Bohol

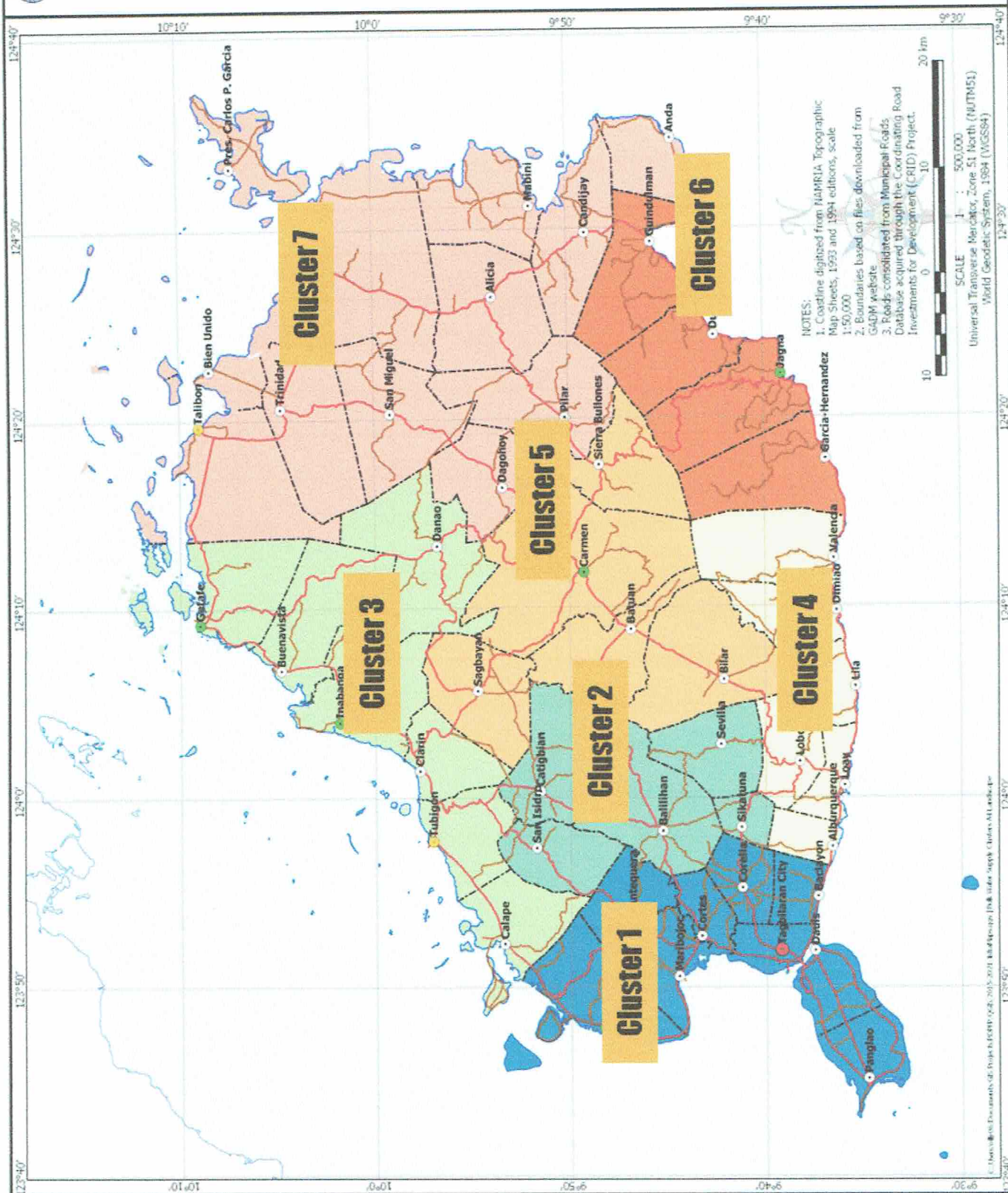
