### **PDC EXECOM RESOLUTION NO. 40-2021**

**A RESOLUTION FAVORABLY ENDORSING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND INDUSTRY (DTI) REGIONAL OFFICE - 7 AND THE CENTRAL VISAYAS REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL (RDC) THE PRIORITY PROGRAMS, ACTIVITIES AND PROJECTS (PAPS) OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRADE AND INDUSTRY (DTI) – BOHOL OFFICE FOR THE PROVINCE OF BOHOL FOR INCLUSION IN THE CY 2022 DTI BUDGET PROPOSAL**

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Code of 1991 mandates the Provincial Development Councils (PDC) to, among others, appraise, prioritize and coordinate the implementation of socio-economic programs and projects within its territorial coverage;

**WHEREAS**, the Joint Memorandum Circular (JMC) No. 01-2007 of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), National Economic Development Authority (NEDA), Department of Budget and Management (DBM) and the Department of Finance (DOF), National Government, directs for the harmonization, synchronization and interfacing between local government units (LGUs) and National Government Agencies (NGAs) in planning, investment programming, budgeting and expenditure management;

**WHEREAS**, such JMC No. 01-2007 also provides avenues to strengthen NGA-LGU interface such as the participation of NGAs in the PDC in the identification of sectoral targets and prioritizing programs, activities and projects (PAPs);

**WHEREAS**, this Body, consistent to its mandates and pursuant to appropriate national government directives, has required the DTI–Bohol Office, to present its priority PAPs for 2022, to ensure that such projects are aligned and synchronized with the development priorities of the province and facilitate complementation of efforts between NGAs, LGUs, civil society organizations and the private sector;

**WHEREAS**, after review and deliberation, the proposed list of 2022 PAPs of DTI - Bohol Office, which is attached hereto and made an integral part hereof, has been found by this Body to be supportive to the attainment of Bohol's development goals and objectives and therefore worthy of support and endorsement to the DTI Regional Office –7 and the Regional Development Council for inclusion in the 2022 Budget Proposal of the DTI.

**WHEREFORE**, upon proper motion duly seconded, be it resolved by this Body in a meeting duly convened –


**to favorably endorse to the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Regional Office –7 and the Central Visayas Regional Development Council (RDC) the Priority Programs, Activities and Projects (PAPs) of the DTI – Bohol Office for the Province of Bohol for inclusion in the CY 2022 DTI Budget Proposal.**

**RESOLVED FURTHER**, to furnish a copy of the same Resolution to the DTI – Bohol Office for appropriate action.



<b>Cities and Municipalities Competitiveness Index (CMCI)</b>	Cities and municipalities are ranked on their competitiveness based on an overall competitiveness score. The overall competitiveness score is the sum of scores on four main pillars which pool data from several sub-indicators. The four main pillars are: economic dynamism, government efficiency, infrastructure and resiliency. Scores are determined by the values of the actual data, as well as the completeness of the submitted data. The higher the score of a city or municipality, the more competitive it is. <b>Industry Cluster Enhancement (ICE) Program</b>	A major strategy to help achieve globally- competitive and innovative industry and services sector that contributes significantly to inclusive growth and employment generation. <b>Shared Service Facilities (SSF)</b>	The SSF is a flagship project of the DTI aimed at improving MSME productivity and efficiency through better access to technology. It is meant to improve MSME competitiveness by providing machinery, equipment, tools, systems, accessories and other auxiliary items, skills and knowledge under a shared system. The facilities should help target beneficiaries increase their production capacities and improve product quality, resulting to increased markets, increased sales, and jobs generation. <b>One Town, One Product [OTOP Next Gen]</b>	OTOP is a priority stimulus program for Micro, Small and Medium-scale enterprises (MSMEs) as government's customized intervention to drive inclusive local economic growth. The program enables localities and communities to determine, develop, support, and promote products or services that are rooted in its local culture, community resource, creativity, connection, and competitive advantage.
