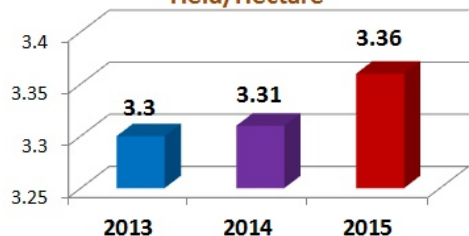

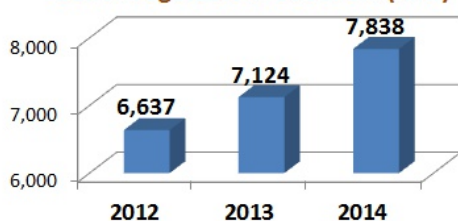


- Increasing Production, Yield per hectare and Sufficiency Ratio of major food commodities

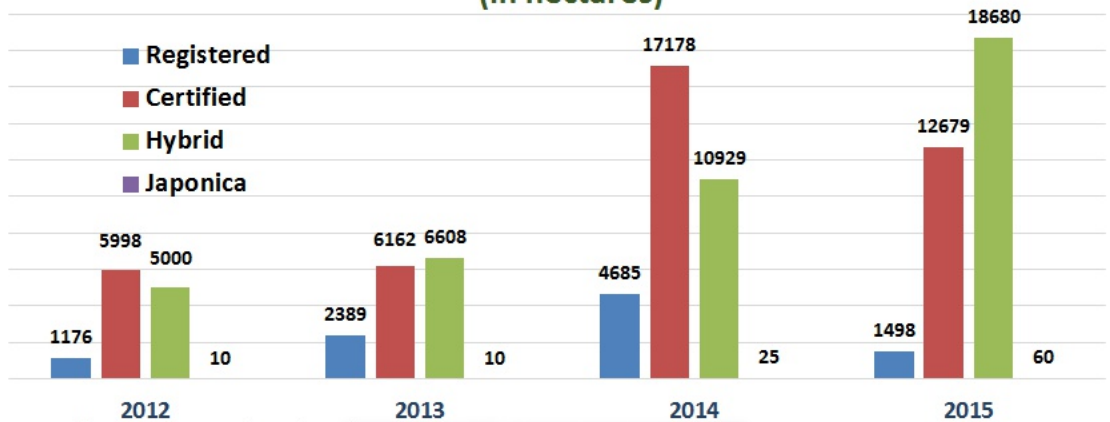

NBI seizes P5.3M shabu in a day's raids in 5 areas

In just a day, a Manila team of the National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) plucked at least 13 drug personalities and seized a cache of firearms and shabu during a string of raids in Pangasinan City, NBI took until 7 p.m. to turn over the arrested persons to Camp Dagupan.

The NBI team first swooped down the residence of one Luis Habas, also known as Tack, in Barangay Tawala in Pangasinan at around 6 a.m. yesterday.

Without coordinating with the municipal police station, Habas, still in his late 20s, had already been charged of a drug case in 2013.

According to Alama, the Pangasinan police team, then under Chief Inspector Petronilo Cruz Jr., conducted a raid in the house of Habas in 2013, but the latter was not around then, but they proceeded with the raid and confiscated several packs of shabu.

However, the court dismissed the drug case they filed against Habas based on the raid.

This time the NBI team caught Habas by surprise.

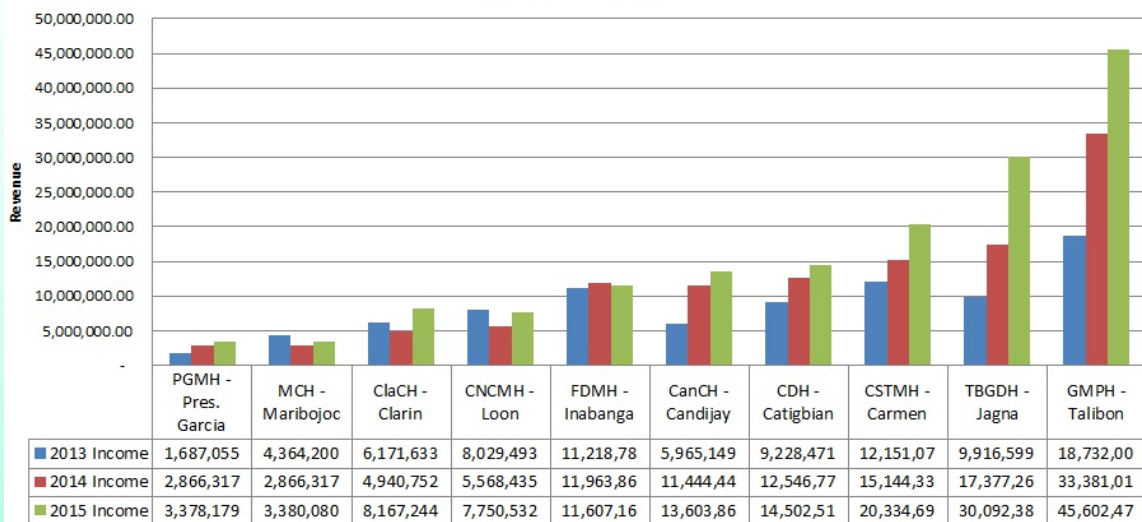

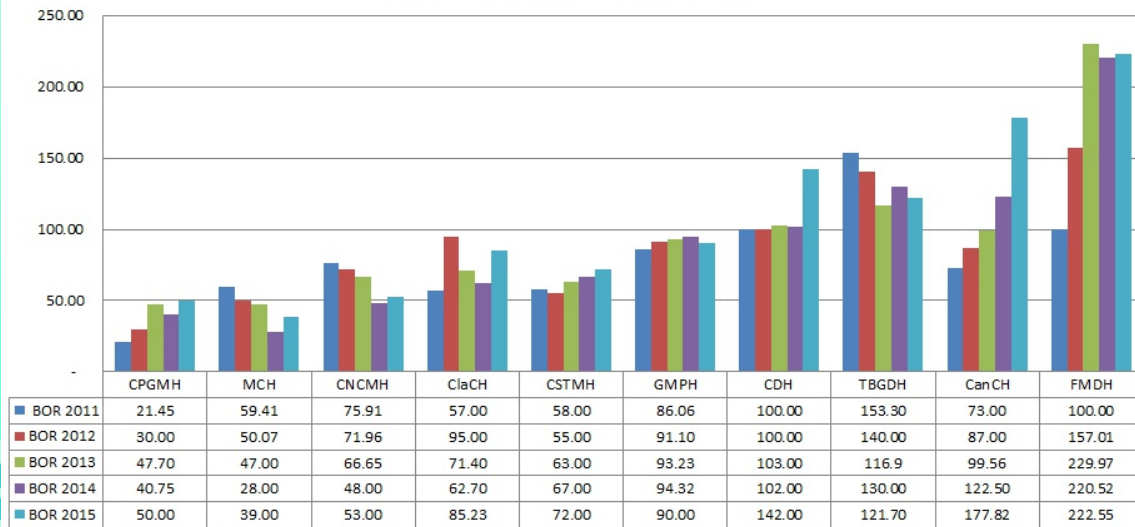

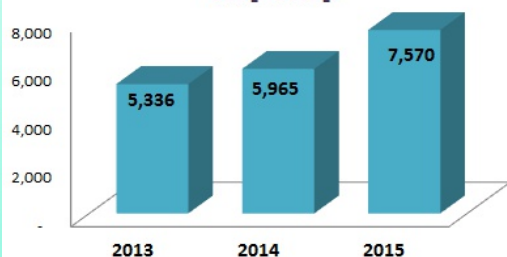

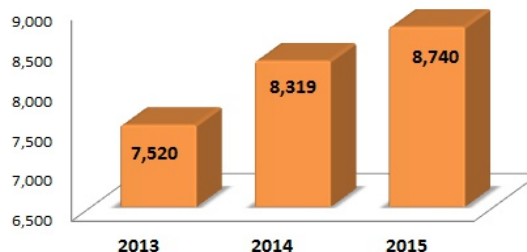

Increase in Total Actual Revenues (2011-2015)



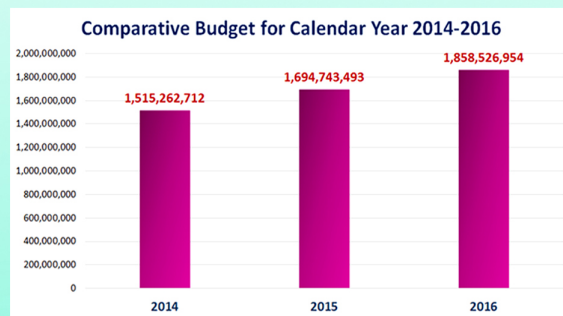
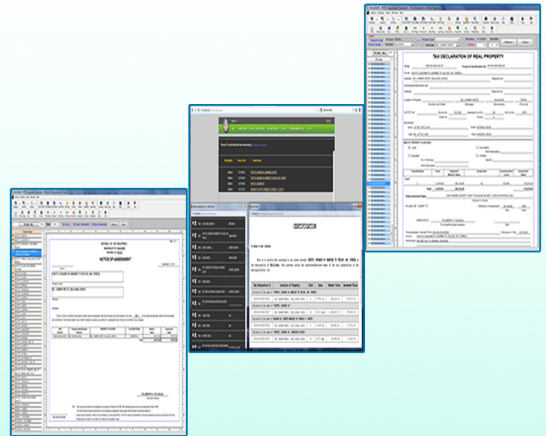

PROJECT JUSTIFICATION

Project Background

✓The establishment of this facility will be in accordance with RA 10630, specifically Sec 49 which states that "Each province and highly-urbanized city (the LGUs) shall be responsible for building, funding and operating a 'Bahay Pag-asa' within their jurisdiction following the standards that will be set by the DSWD and adopted by the JWC".

✓Given the very limited financial resources of the Province and the huge financial requirement of such a facility, it is vital for the LGU to seek other sources to augment its meager available funds in order for it to institute said law.
