



Bohol Vegetable Production (m.t.)









NBI seizes P5.3M shabu in a day's raids in 5 areas








Increase in Total Actual Revenues (2011-2015)

Increase in Local Revenues (2013-2015)





❖ Project Background

✓The establishment of this facility will be in accordance with RA 10630, specifically Sec 49 which states that "Each province and highly-urbanized city (the LGUs) shall be responsible for building, funding and operating a "Bahay Pag-asa" within their jurisdiction following the standards that will be set by the DSWD and adopted by the JJWC".
