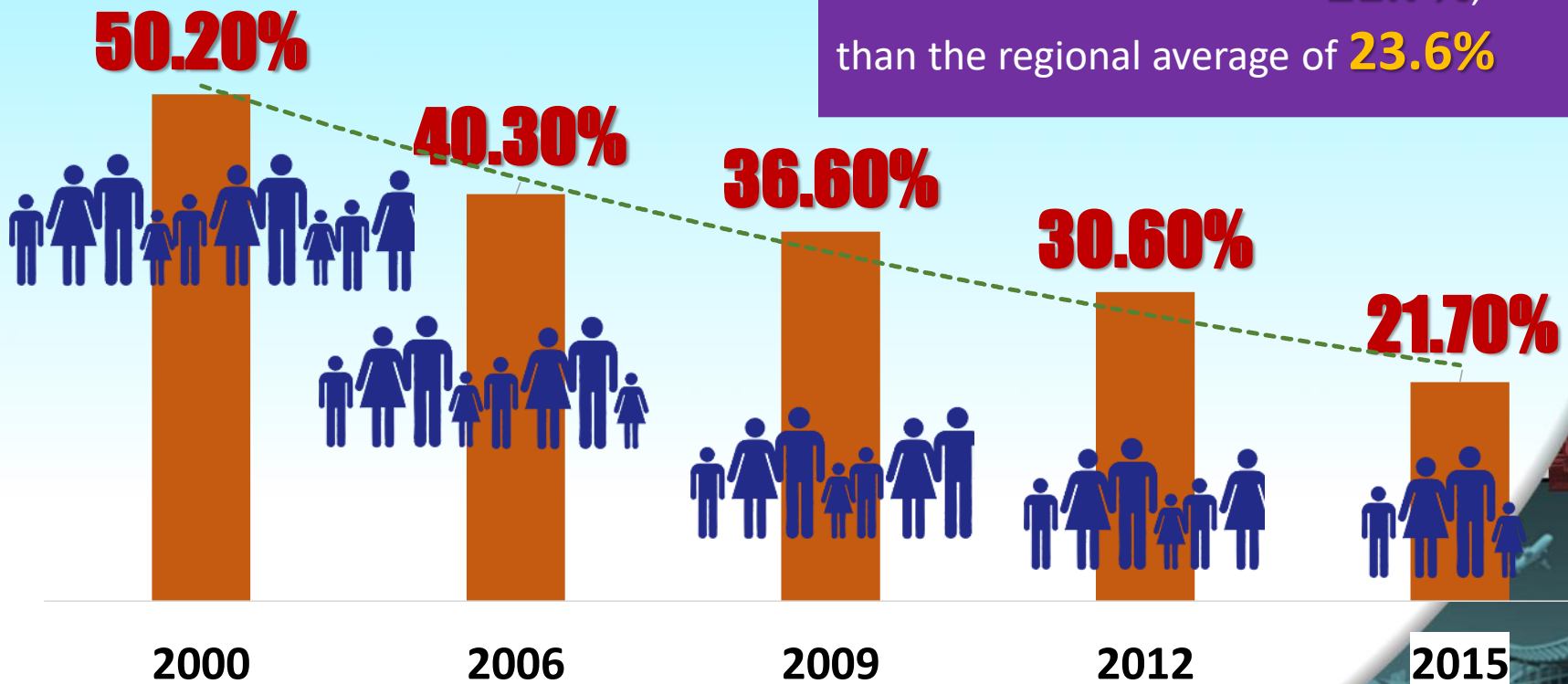

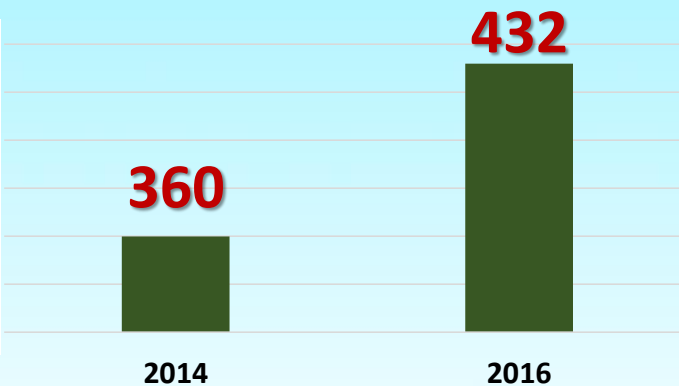

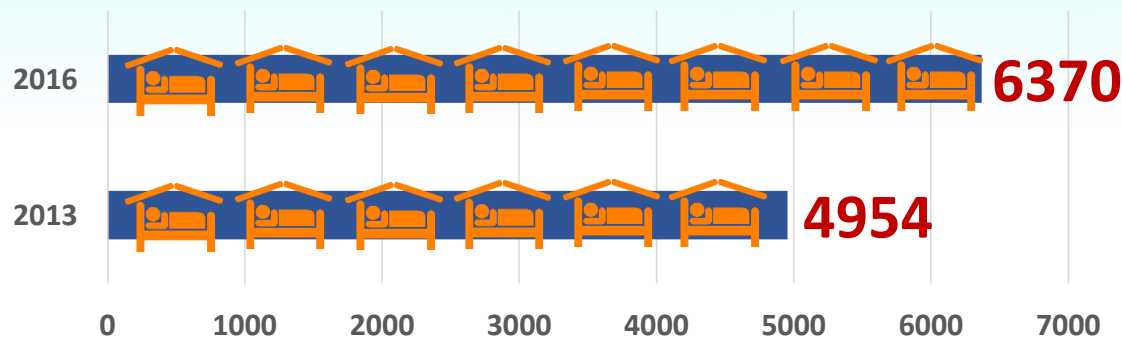

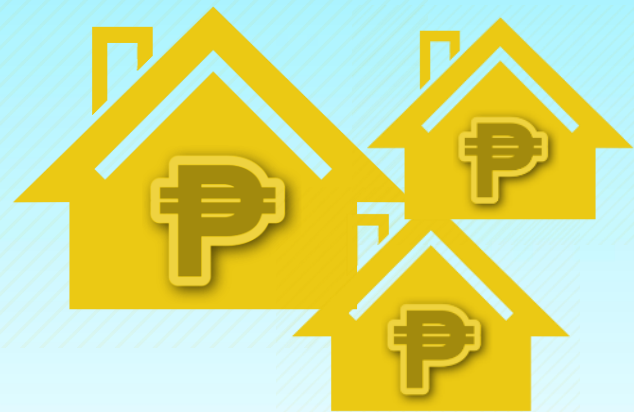

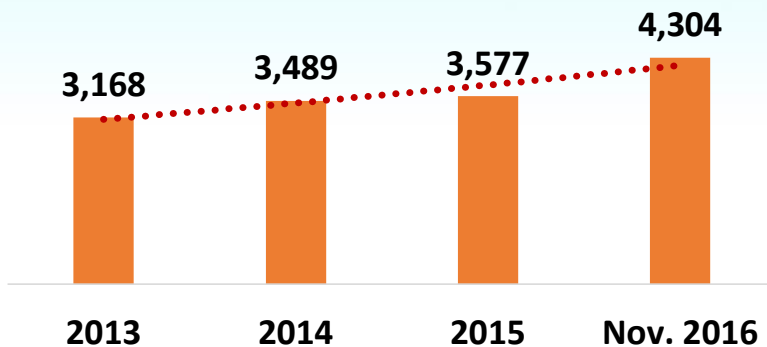

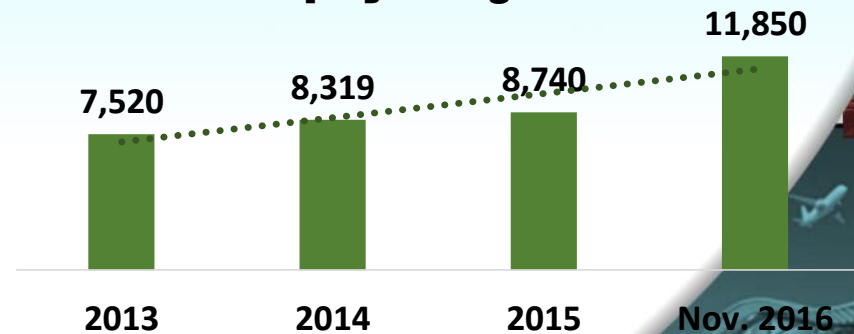

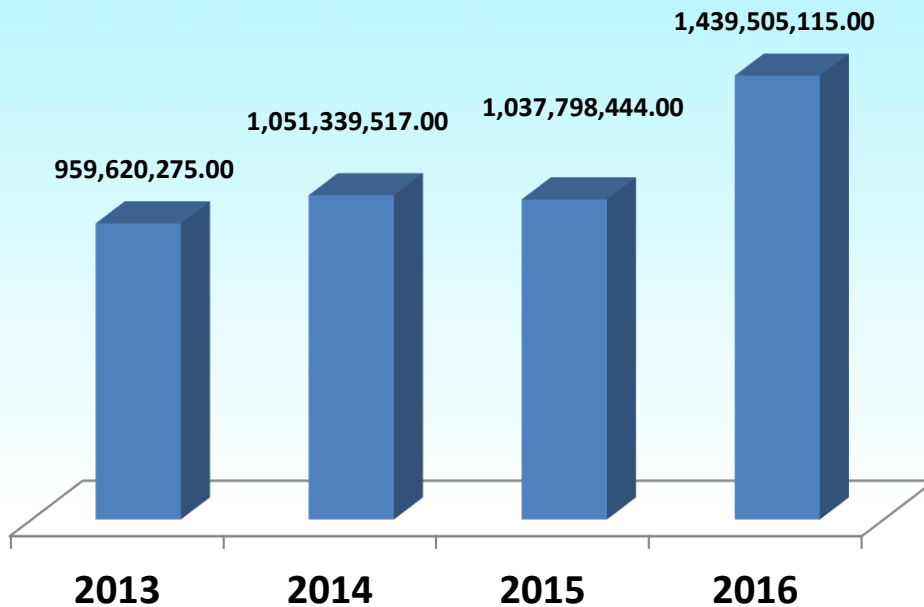

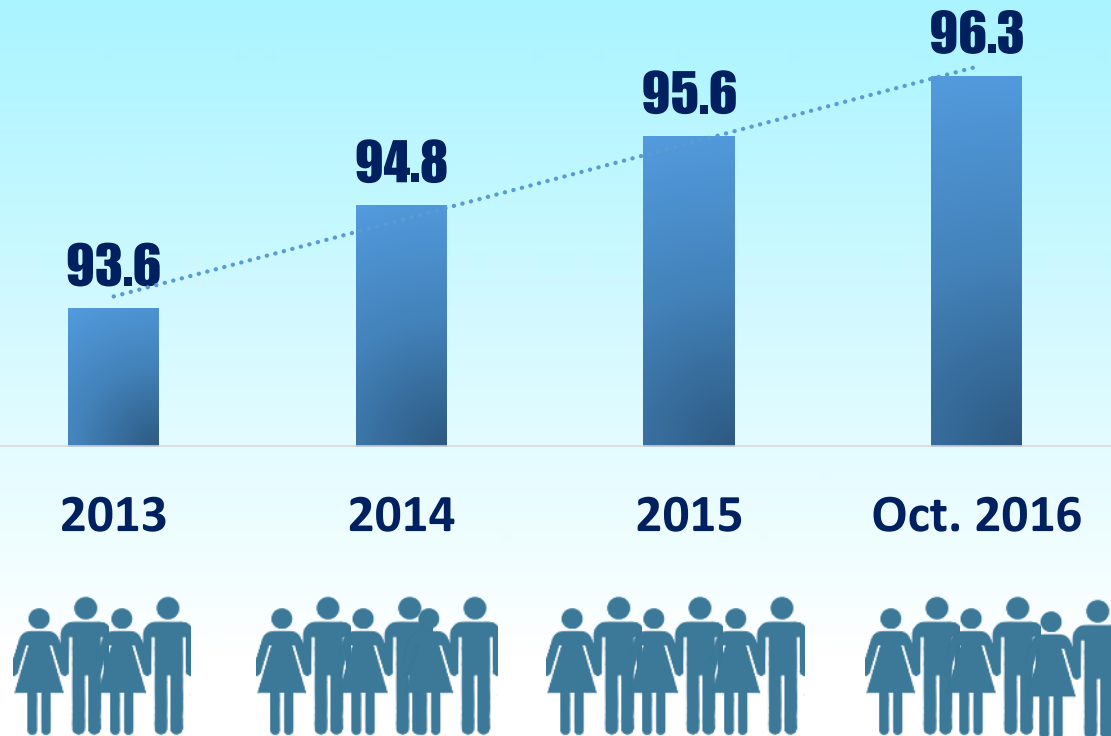

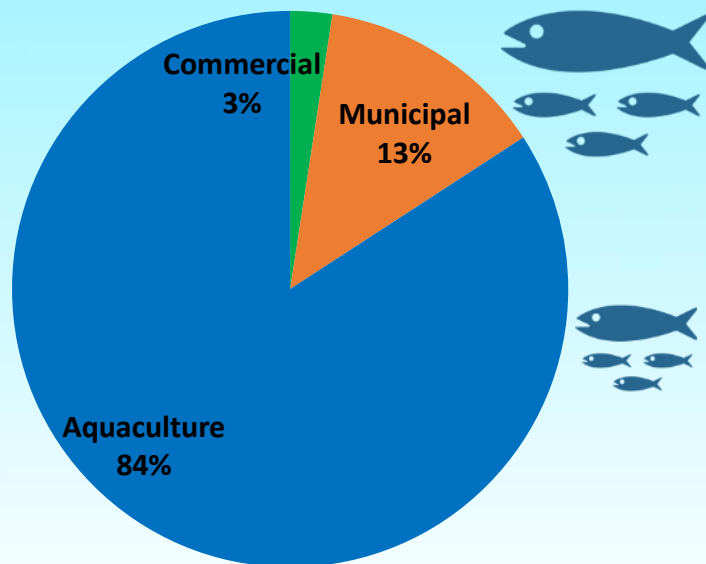

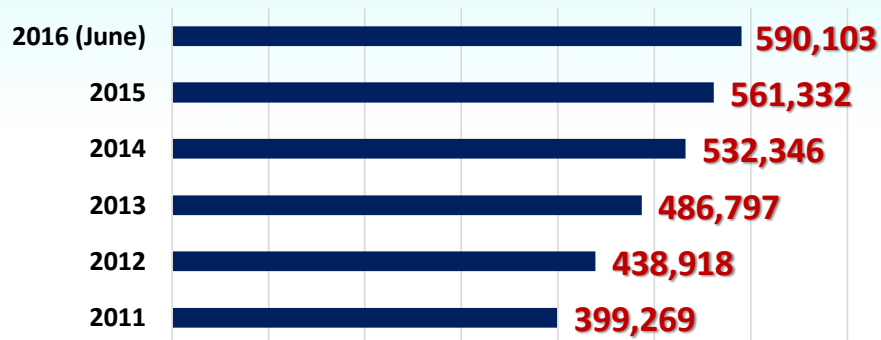

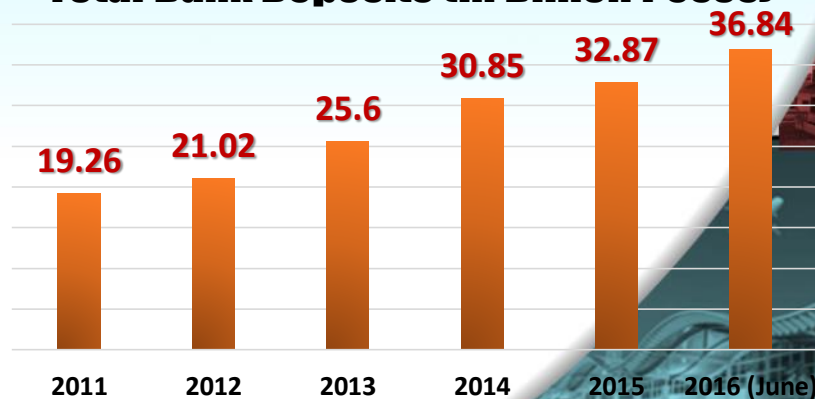

Total Bank Deposits (in Billion Pesos)

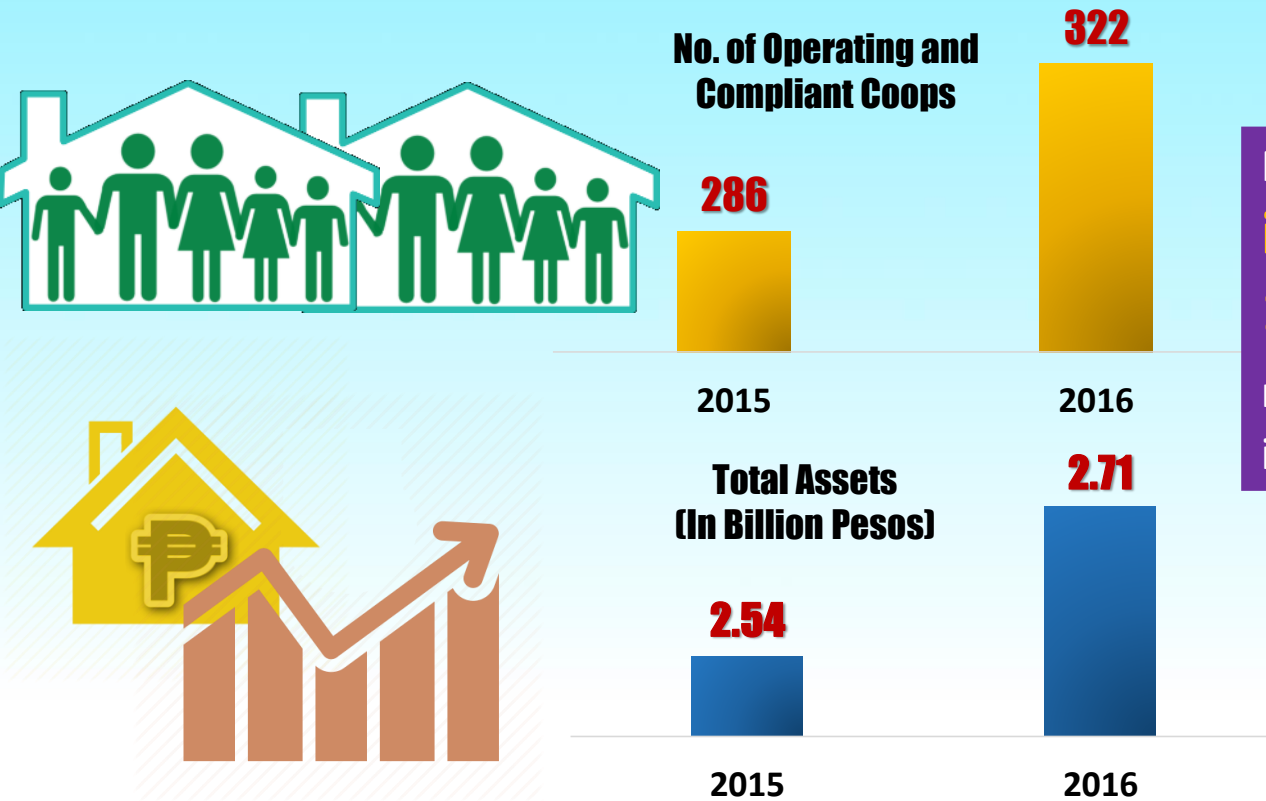

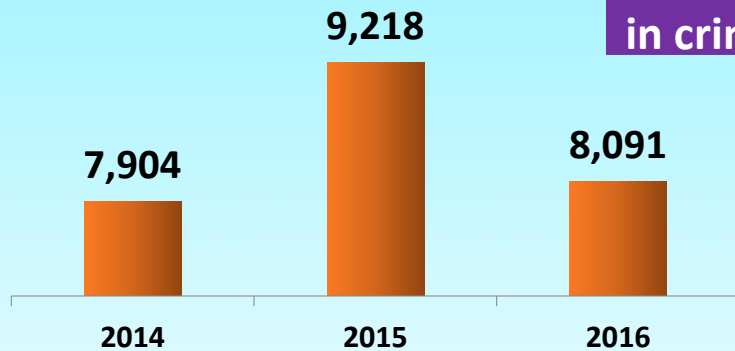

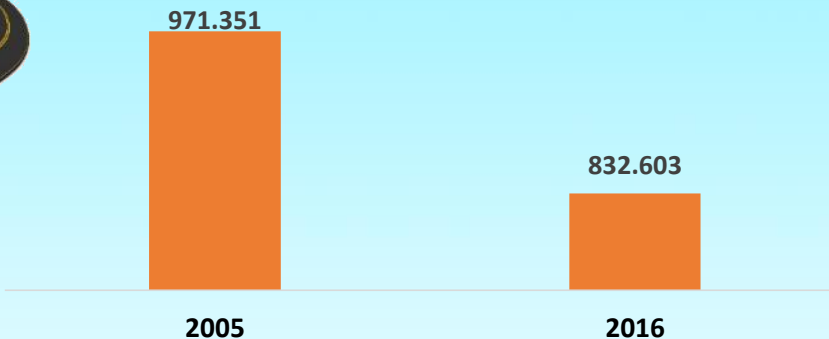

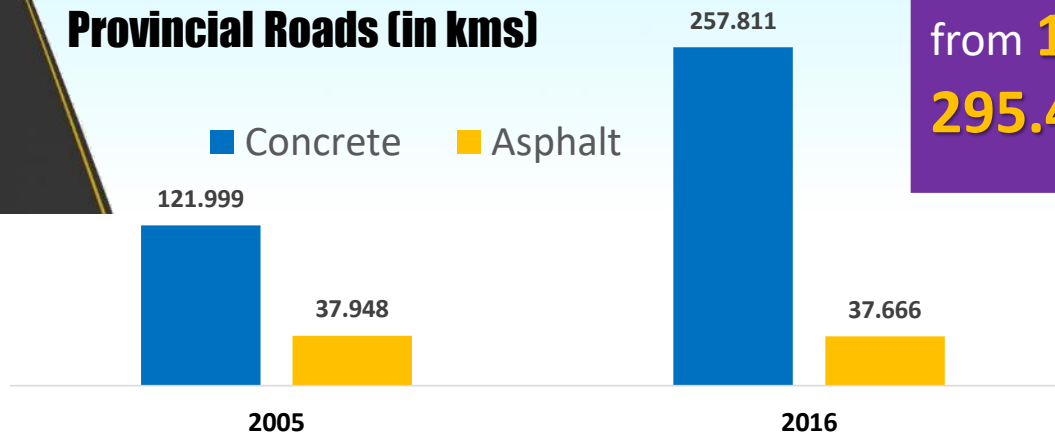
Length of Provincial Roads

Concrete/ asphalt road increased from **159.947 kms** in 2005 to **295.477 kms** in 2016

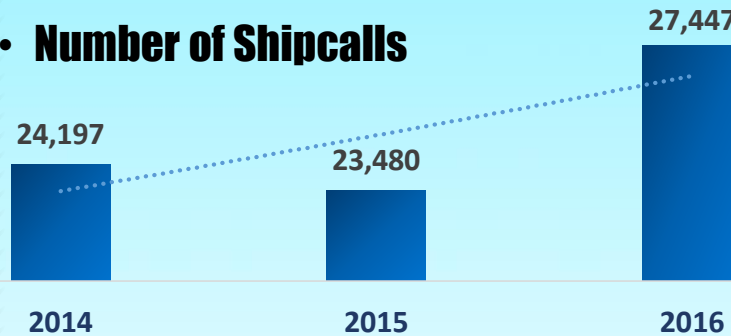

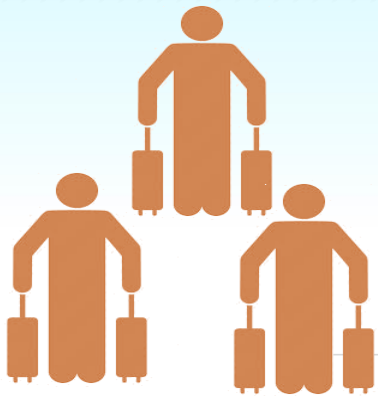

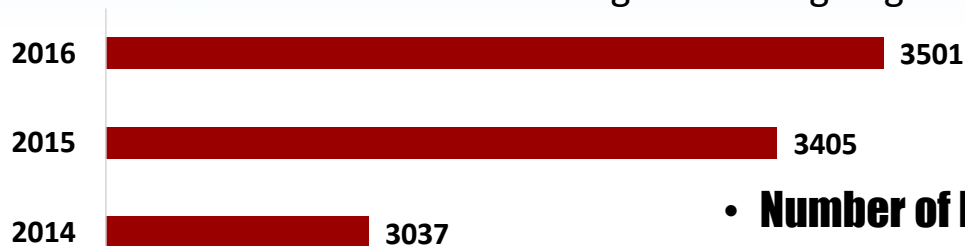

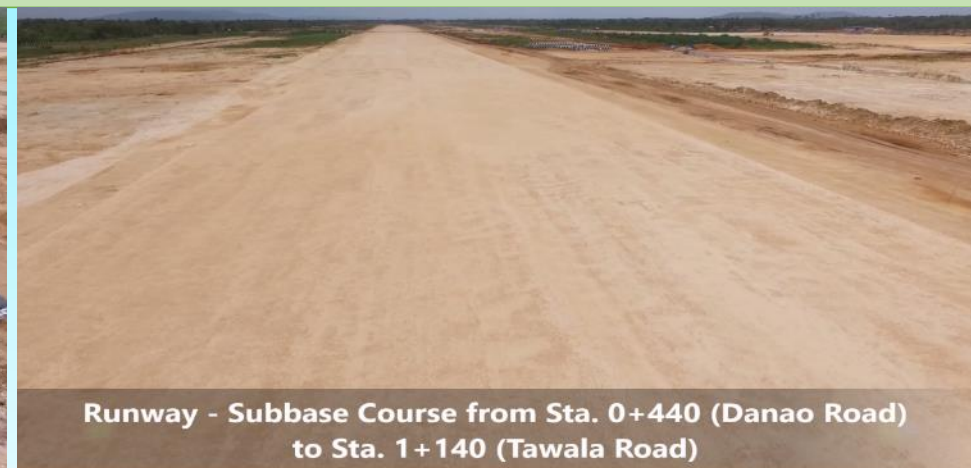


VO No.3A: Runway Length is extended to 2,500 m

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE PROVINCIAL ANTI-DRUG ABUSE COUNCIL (PADAC).

(Authored by: Hon. Edgar M. Charte, Vice Governor
Sponsored by: Hon. Lemuel E. Diga)

Be it enacted by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in session assembled -

Section 1. TITLE

This ordinance shall be known as the "Provincial Anti-Drug Abuse Council (PADAC) - Ordinance of 1996"

Section 2. POLICY STATEMENT

It is the policy of the Province of Bohol to promote a healthy, peaceful and drug-free environment that gives the youth opportunities for total development. An environment that assures them of good ideas in their heads and moral character in their hearts.

Section 3. CREATION OF PADAC, POWERS AND FUNCTIONS

There is hereby created a Provincial Anti-Drug Abuse Council (PADAC). The PADAC or Council shall have the following powers and functions:

- 3.1 To formulate measures, programs and framework for prevention and control of drug and other substance abuse.
- 3.2 Recommend concrete measures for the implementation of the Anti-Drug Abuse Program and shall be responsible in ensuring that the Anti-Drug Abuse Program will be implemented down to the barangay level.
- 3.3 Serves as the Provincial Consultative body on drug abuse issues.
- 3.4 Shall coordinate and unite all offices, agencies, groups, private and public, to support and participate in the anti-drug abuse campaign program.

Section 4. COMPOSITION, OFFICERS

The Provincial Anti-Drug Abuse Council (PADAC) shall be composed of the following officials and members:

4.A. OFFICIALS

- 4.A.1. Chairman: The Provincial Governor
- 4.A.2. Co Chairman: The Vice Governor
- 4.A.3. Action Officer: Any member of the National Movement of Young Legislators to be appointed by the Chairman.
- 4.A.4. The Coordinators: There shall be three Coordinators of the Council who shall be the head of the Three Committees namely:
 - 1) Coordinator for Awareness, Information and Education (AIE) Campaign Committee:

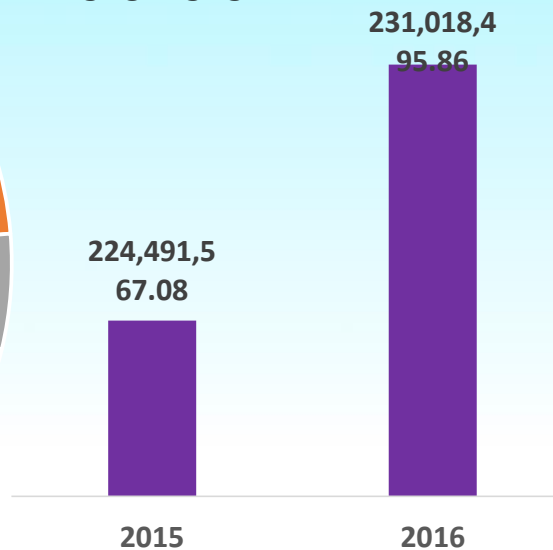

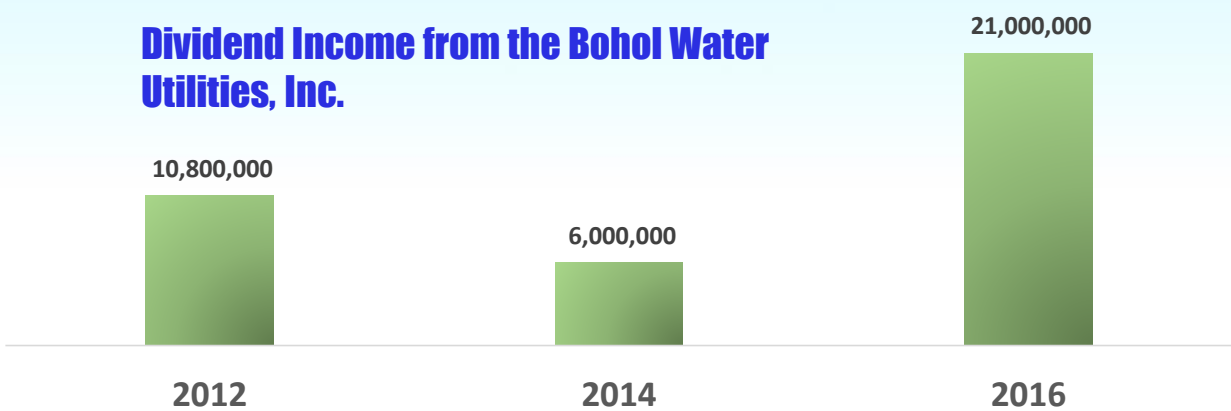

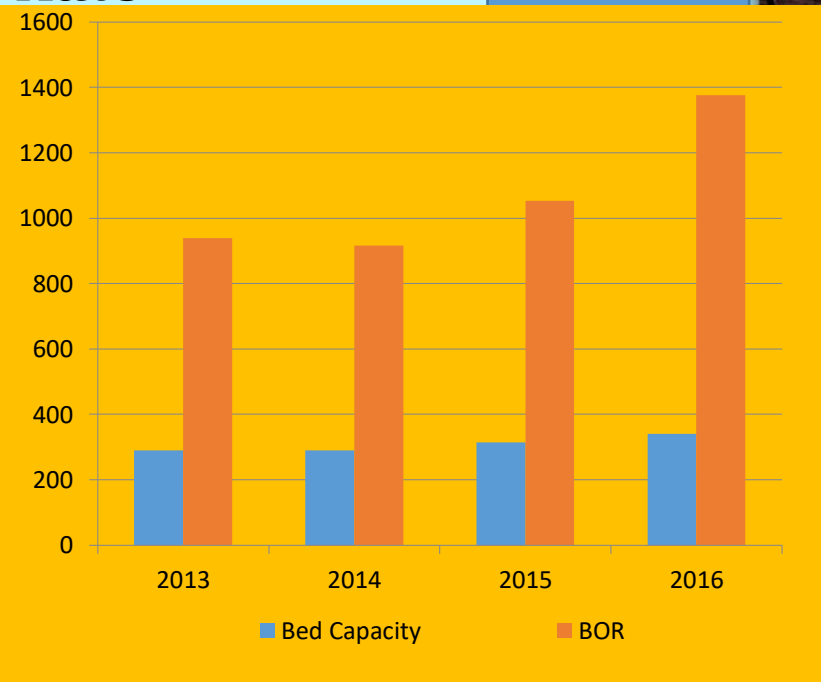

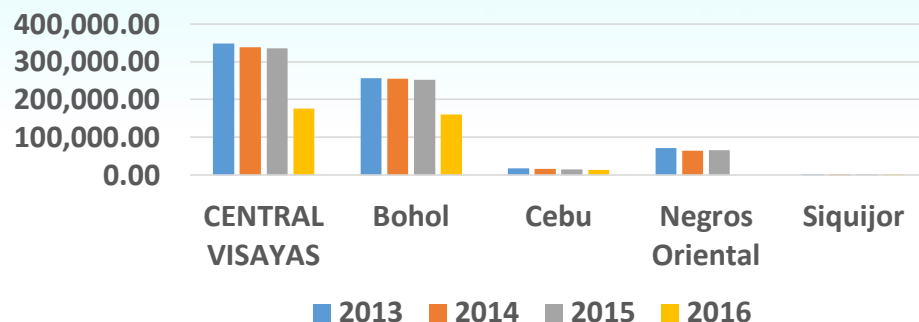

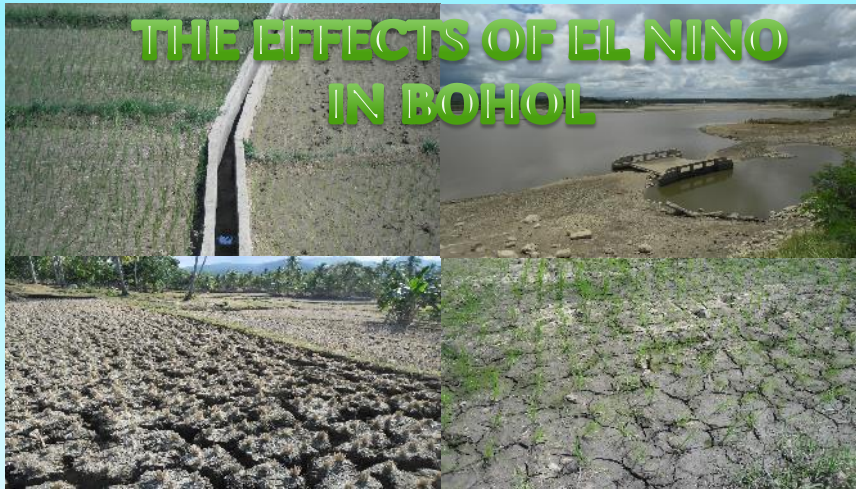

Philippine Long Distance Telephone Company (PLDT) and Globe Telecom have completed upgrading Bohol's connectivity to the national fiber optic node into fully-protected submarine cables that go through different routes and are ready for commercial use.
