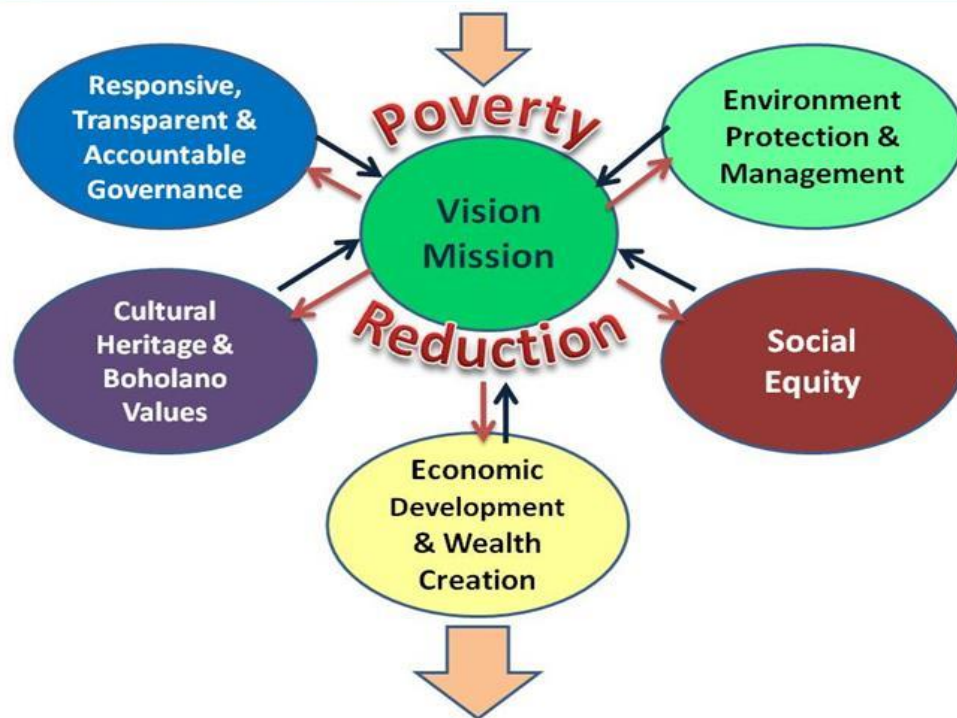

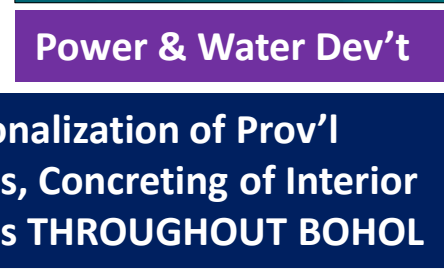

Other Challenges at the start of our term:

1. Sectoral challenges

- in terms of increasing performance in health, education, agriculture, tourism, etc.

2. Financial management challenges

- COA Adverse Opinions from previous admin and cases filed against PGBh officials

3. Continuation of the New Bohol Airport Project

- Lands already procured, but no funding for civil works
- Underwent re-study between Panglao or Tagbilaran expansion



Other Challenges at the start of our term:

4. **Old Capitol requiring more space**
 - Also, one-stop shop needs
5. **Threats to internal peace and security**
 - Even as Bohol was declared insurgency-free
6. **Low investment in Provincial Hospitals**
 - Pitogo and Clarin hospitals facing closure
7. **ISO Accreditation**
 - Failed renewal
8. **Major projects with negative environmental consequences**
 - In the pipeline at the time



Other Challenges at the start of our term:

9. Joint Venture for Power and Water

- Cases filed
- Not substantial dividend income at the time

10. Local governance

- Bohol not yet ranked among the Top 10 Best-Governed Provinces under the Local Governance Performance Management System (LGPMS)

11. High poverty indicators

12. Low tourist arrivals

13. Moderate economic growth

14. No fiber-optic interconnection

- Bohol was not part of the communications highway

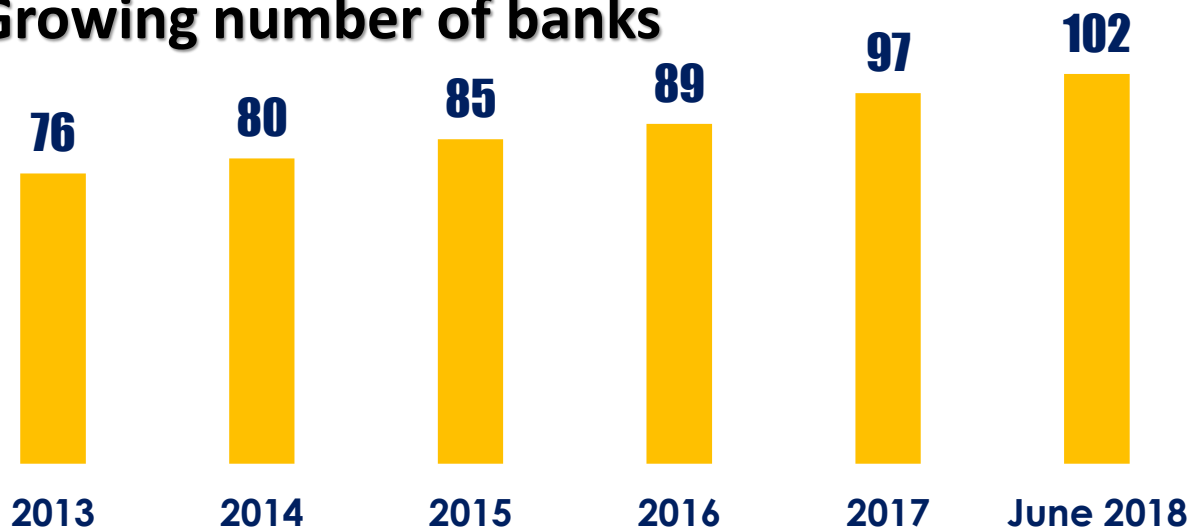

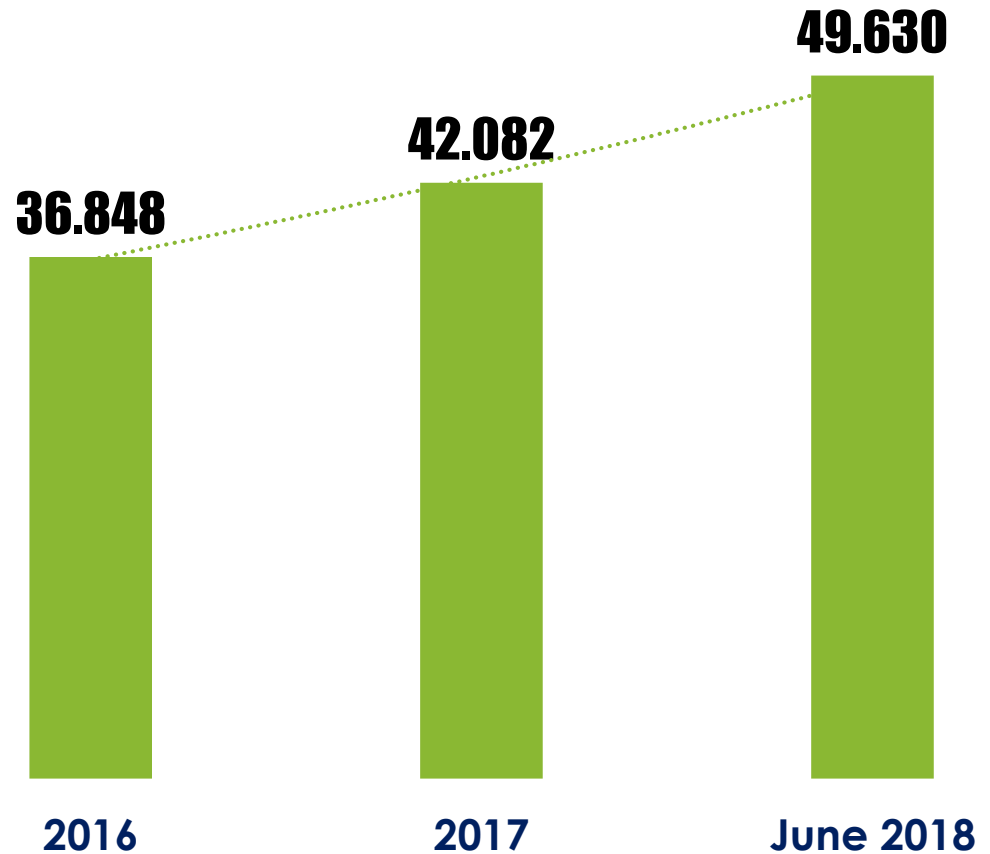

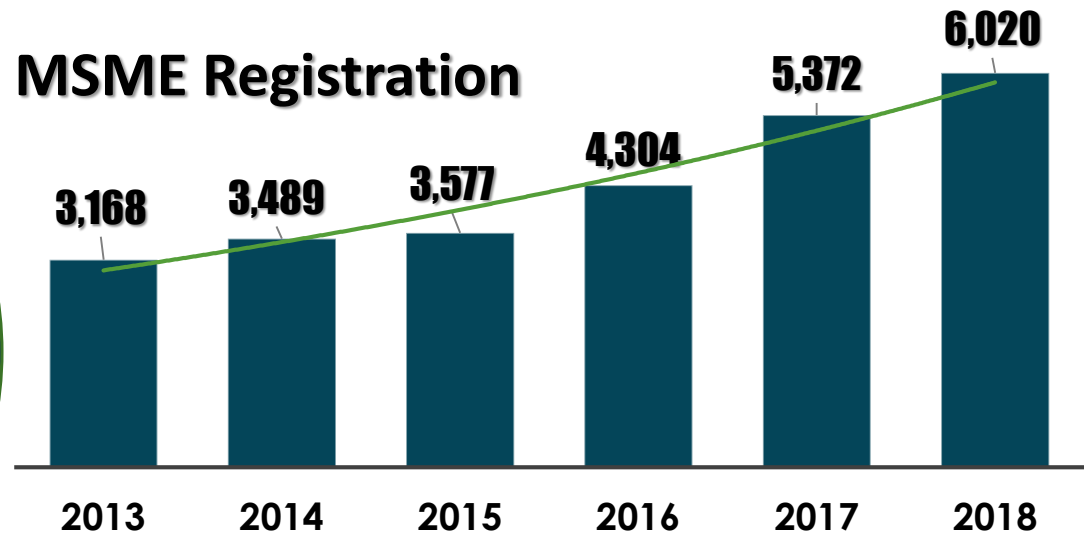

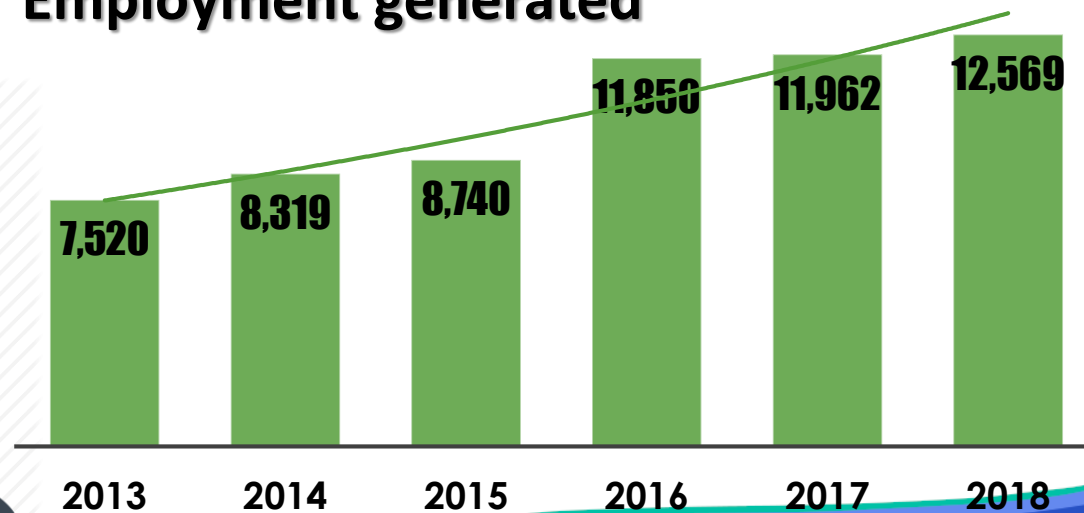

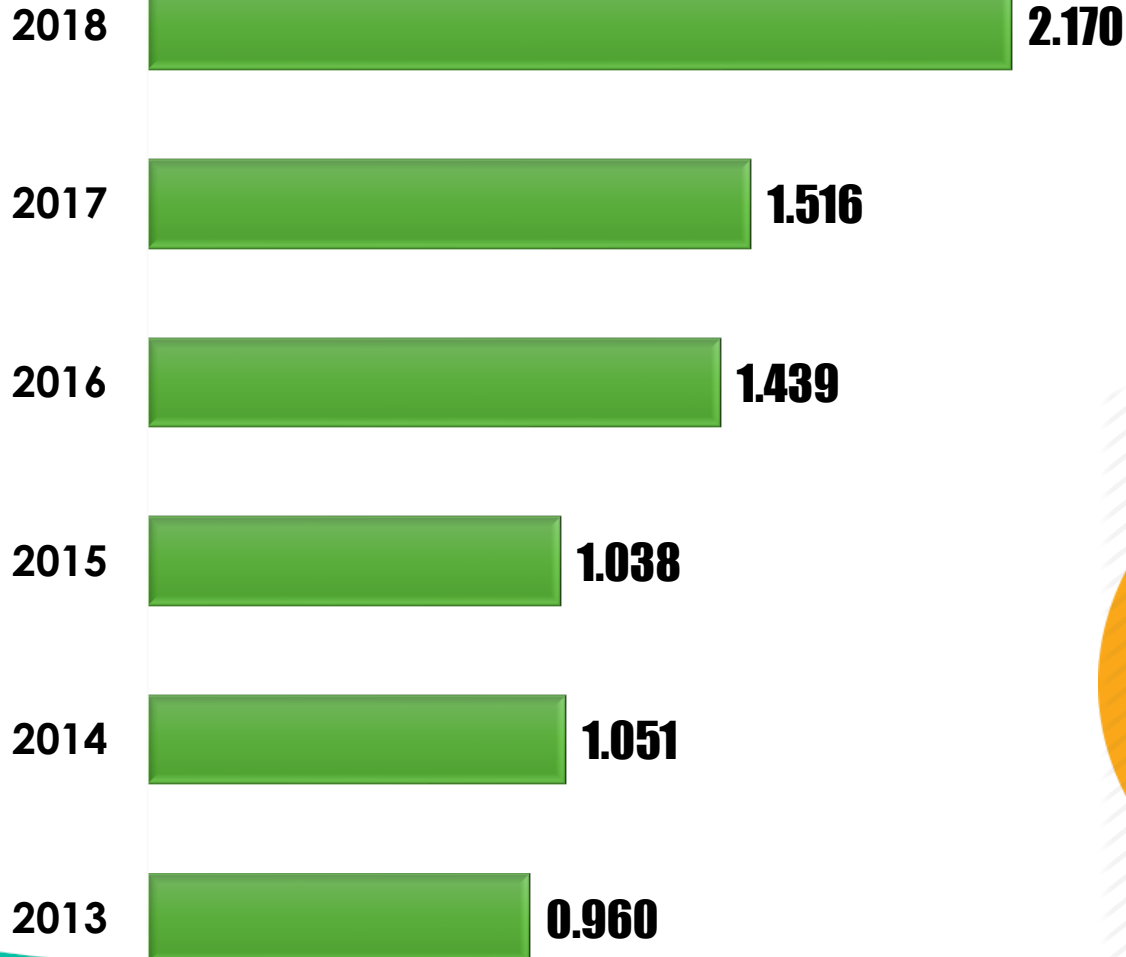

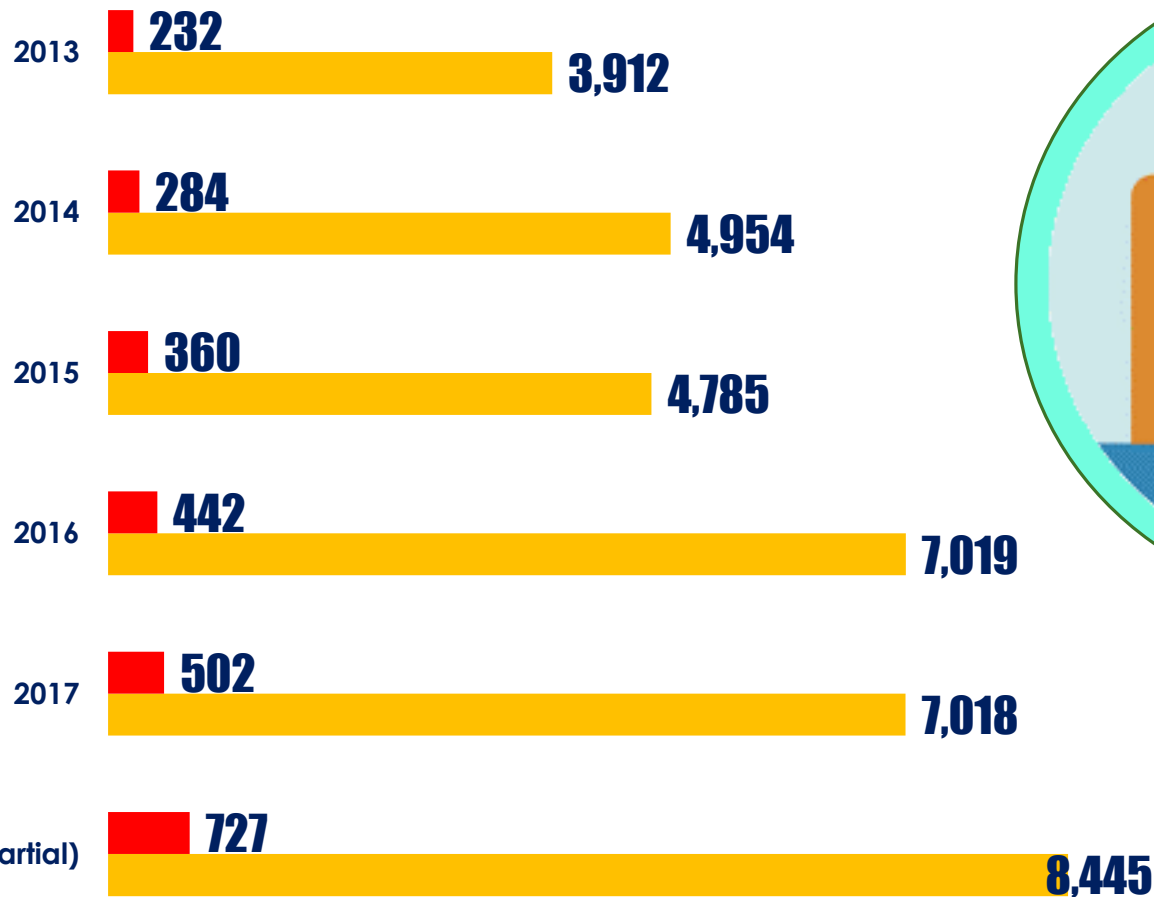

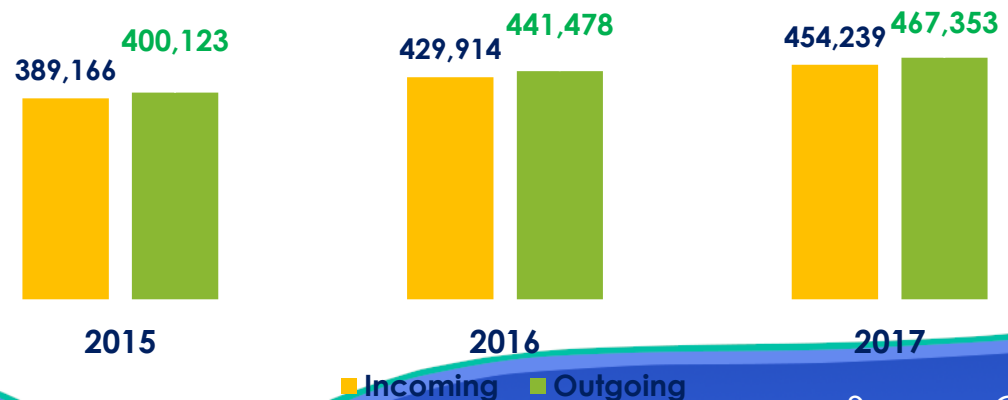

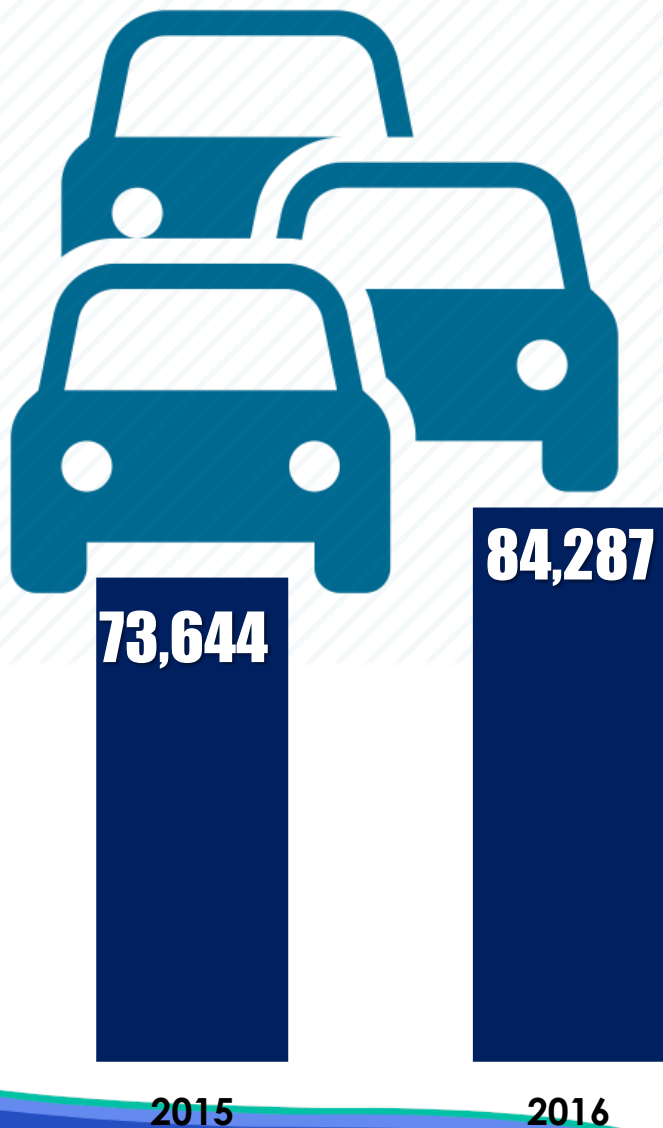
Number of Incoming & Outgoing Flights



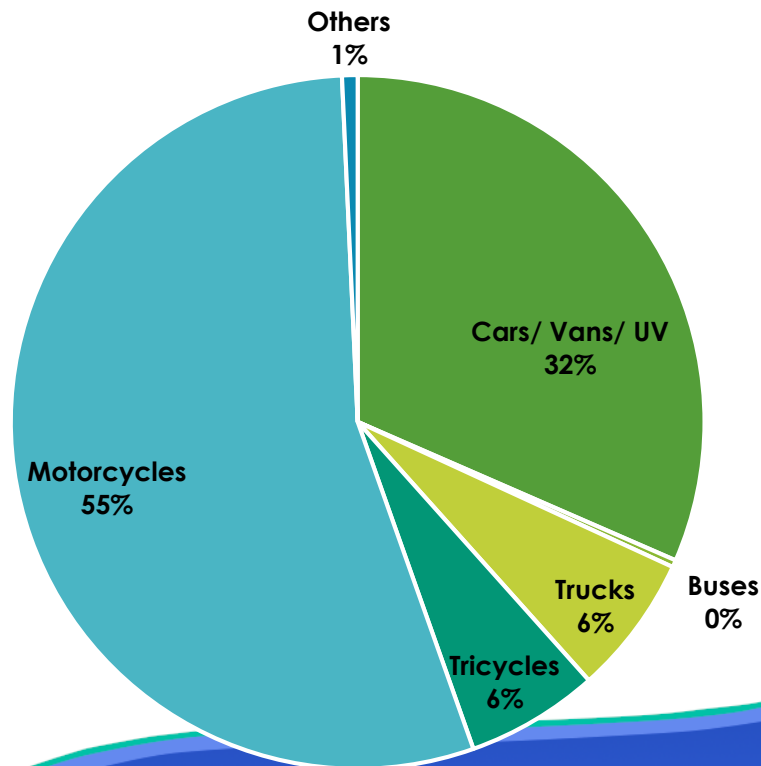
Number of Incoming and Outgoing Passengers

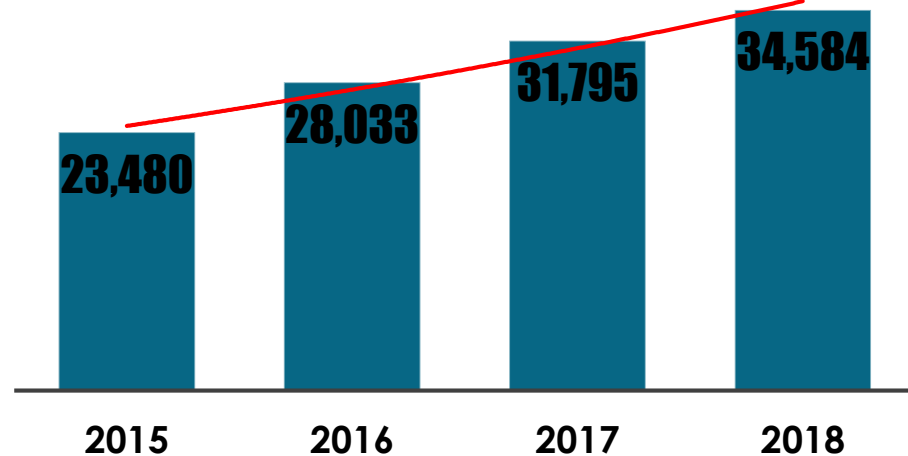

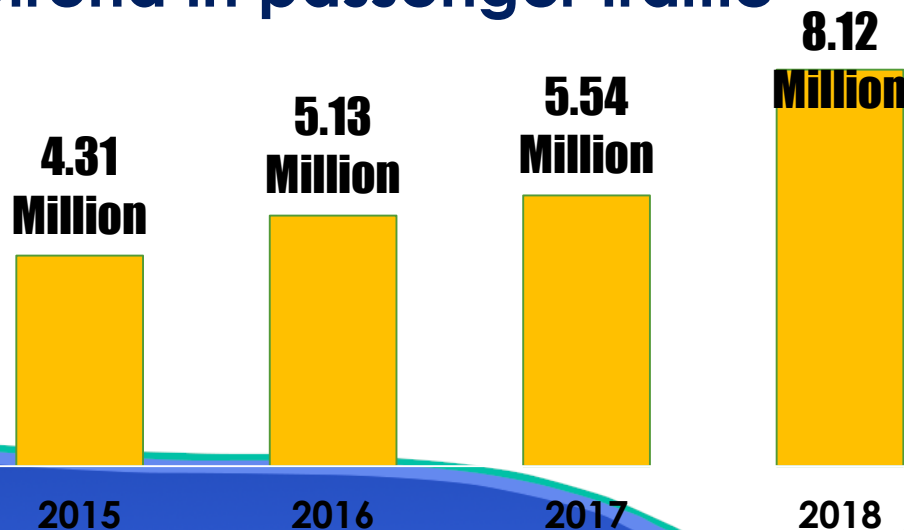

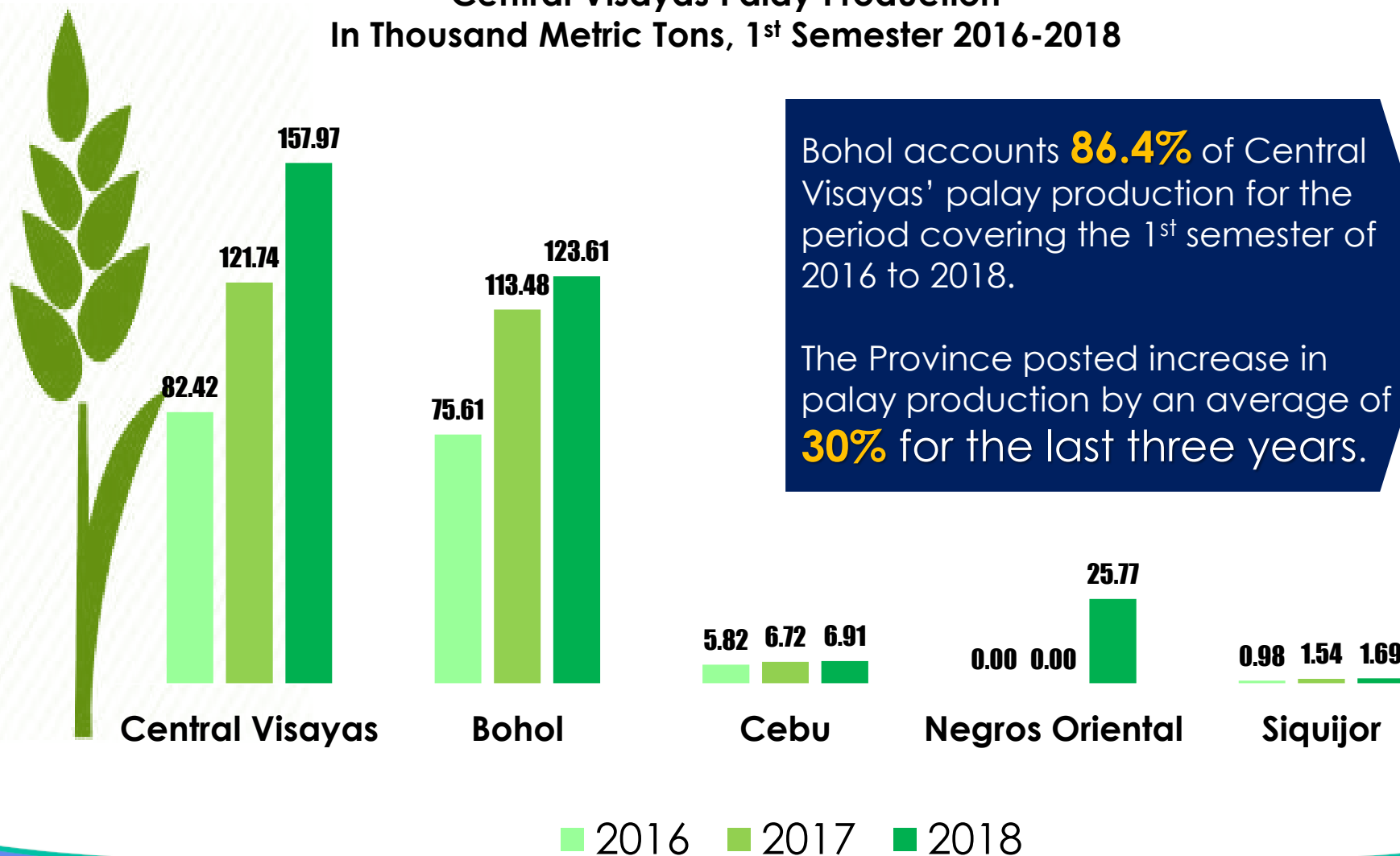

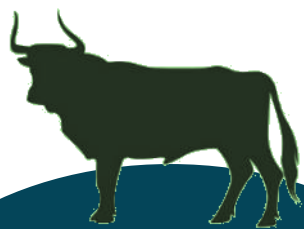

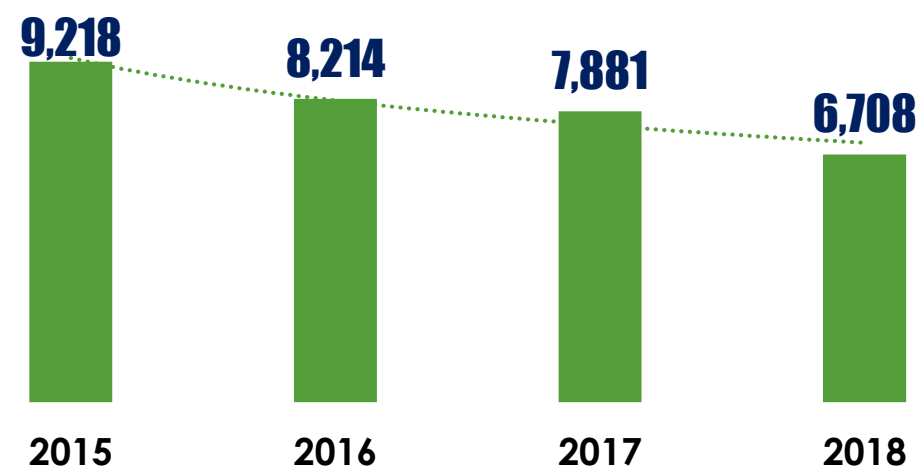

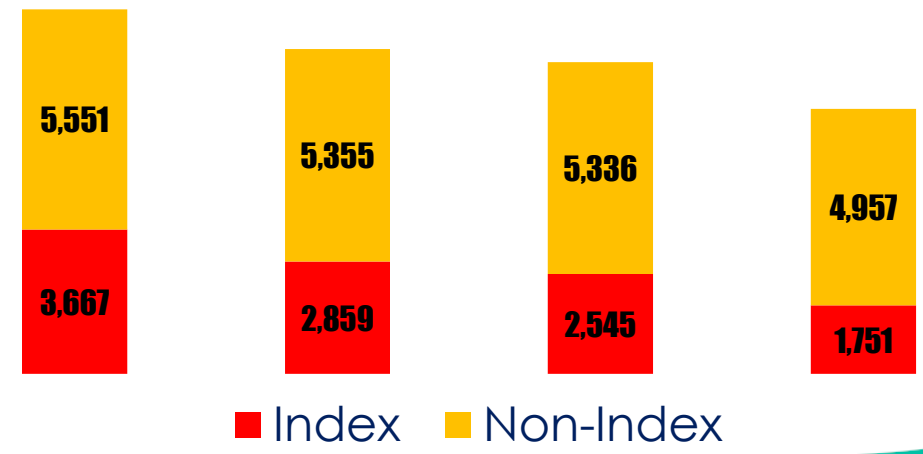


Crime volume consistent decreased for the past 4 years and posting an average annual drop of reported crimes by **10%**

Crime Volume

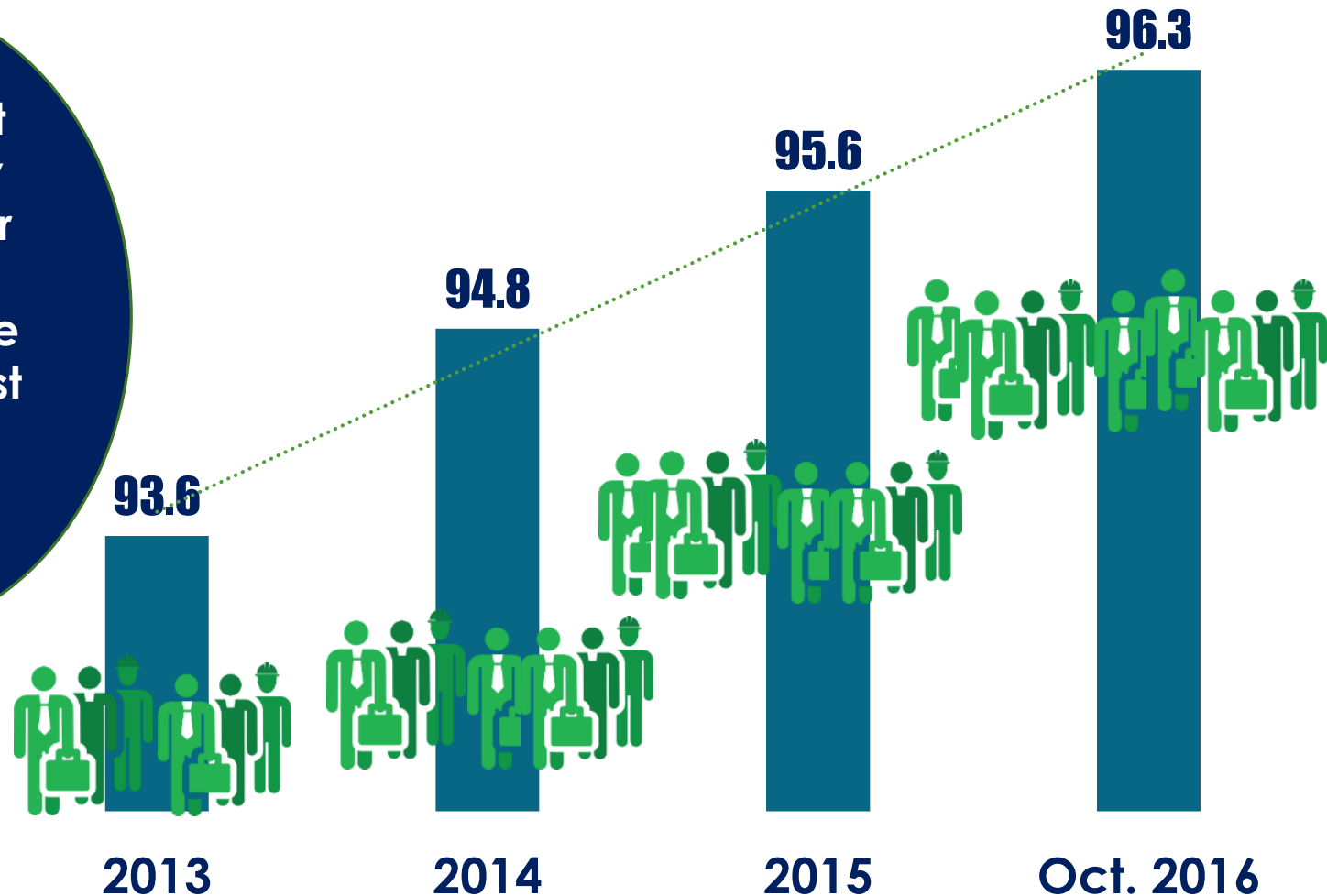


Index and non-Index Crimes

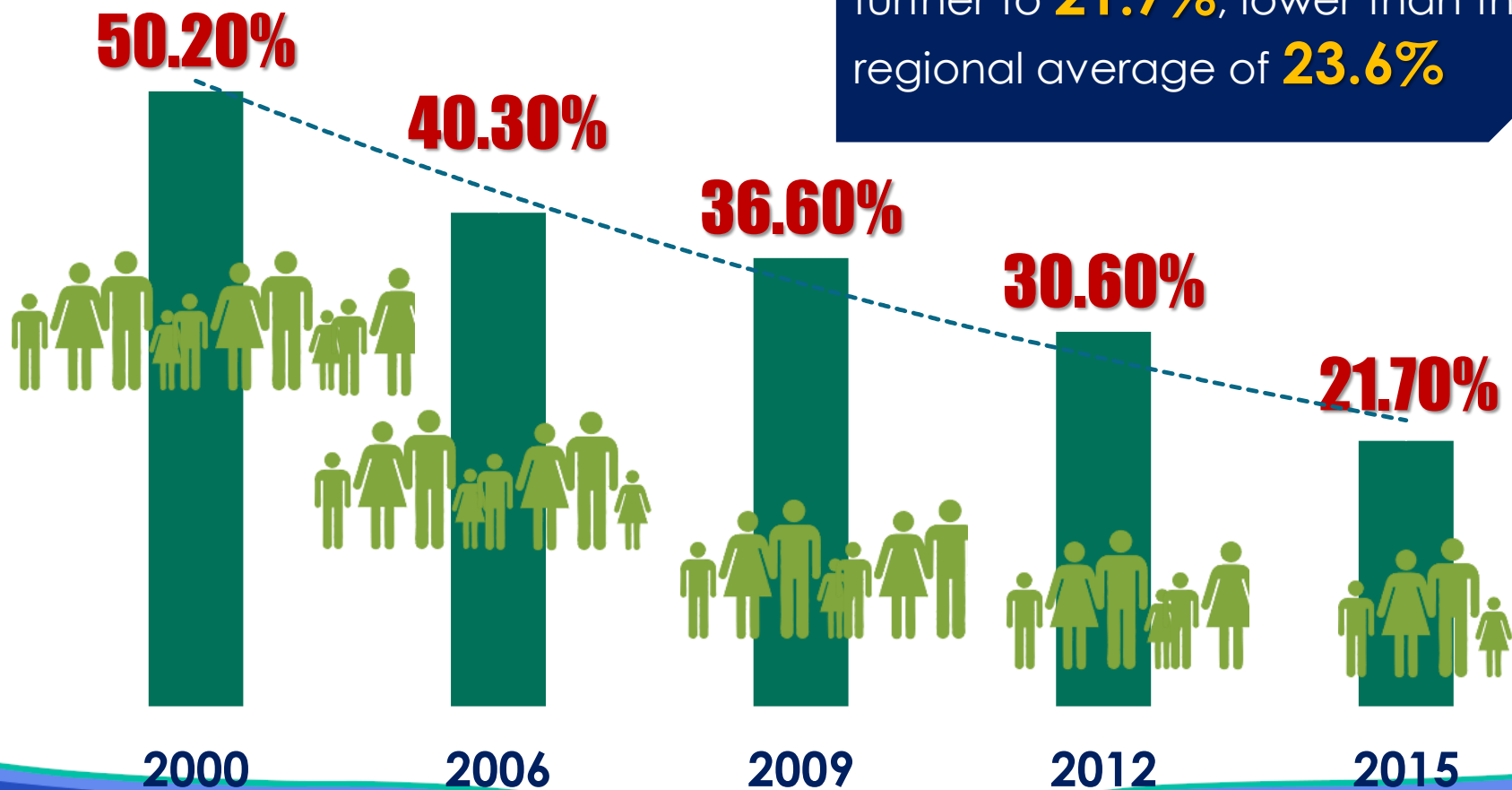

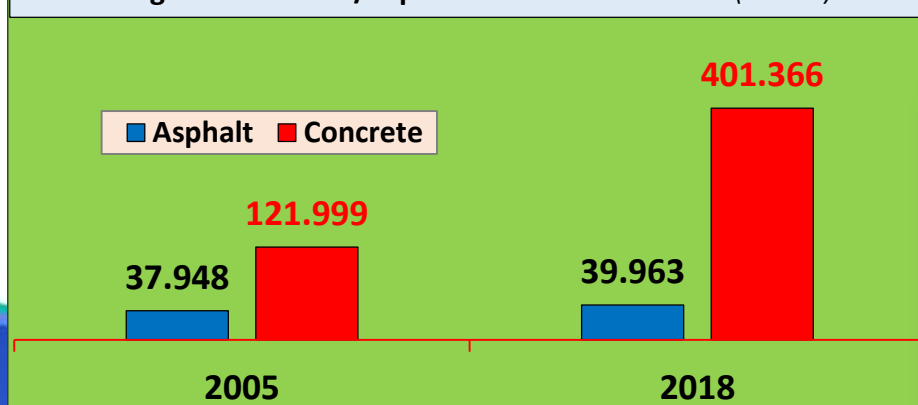

The fulfillment of the opening and operation of the Bohol-Panglao International Airport (BPIA) is a great breakthrough in the development of the Province of Bohol.

Initially conceptualized by Gov. Constancio Torralba in 1987, various Local Government Executives had put their marks in its realization. Initial lot acquisitions were started during the term of Gov. David B. Tirol, which was continued during Gov. Rene L. Relampagos' term. Fund sourcing for vertical and horizontal infrastructure became more aggressive during the term of Gov. Erico B. Aumentado. And actual infrastructure construction was fully implemented during the time of Gov. Edgar M. Chatto, leading to its inauguration last November 27, 2018 and eventual operation on November 28, 2018.

The Provincial Government of Bohol Strategic Performance Management System (PGBH SPMS) seeks to link individual performance with the agency's organization vision, mission and strategic goals. This system makes major paradigm shift and tries to address the gaps in the previous performance evaluation systems.

- * The PGBH crafted its own agency SPMS which was conditionally approved by the Civil Service Commission (CSC) on June 13, 2013.
- * Created and institutionalized the Performance Management Team (PMT) through Executive Order No. 11 series of 2013
- * The PMT formulated the Provincial Government of Bohol Strategic Performance Management System Internal Rules, and Regulations (PGBH SPMS IRR) that was approved by the Governor on November 28, 2014.
- * The PGBH SPMS follows the four-stage Performance Management System (PMS) cycle
- * Expanded the composition of the PMT to address issues raised during the series of orientations, information dissemination and workshops conducted
- * Institutionalized the expanded composition of the PMT through Executive Order No. 22 series of 2016
- * Together with this expanded composition, the PGBH SPMS-IRR was enhanced on the second semester of 2016.
- * As proof that the PGBH has fully implemented the SPMS, The Civil Service Commission conferred to the Provincial Government of Bohol with PHIME-HRM Maturity Level 2 on Performance Management on December 15, 2016.
- * For continual improvement and to answer the current trends, the PGBH SPMS-IRR was enhanced on May 31, 2017

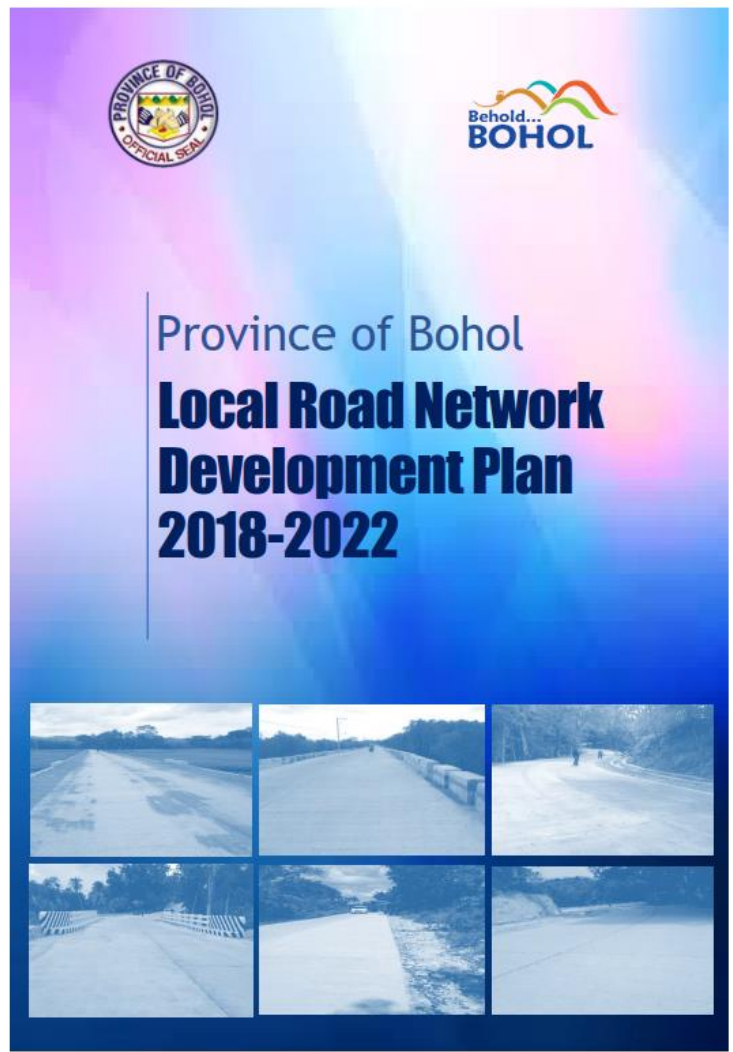

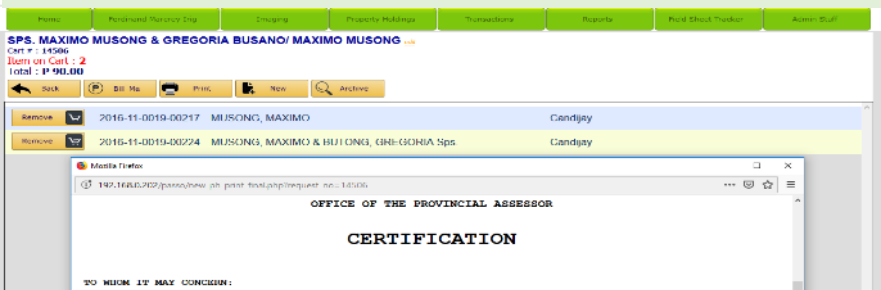

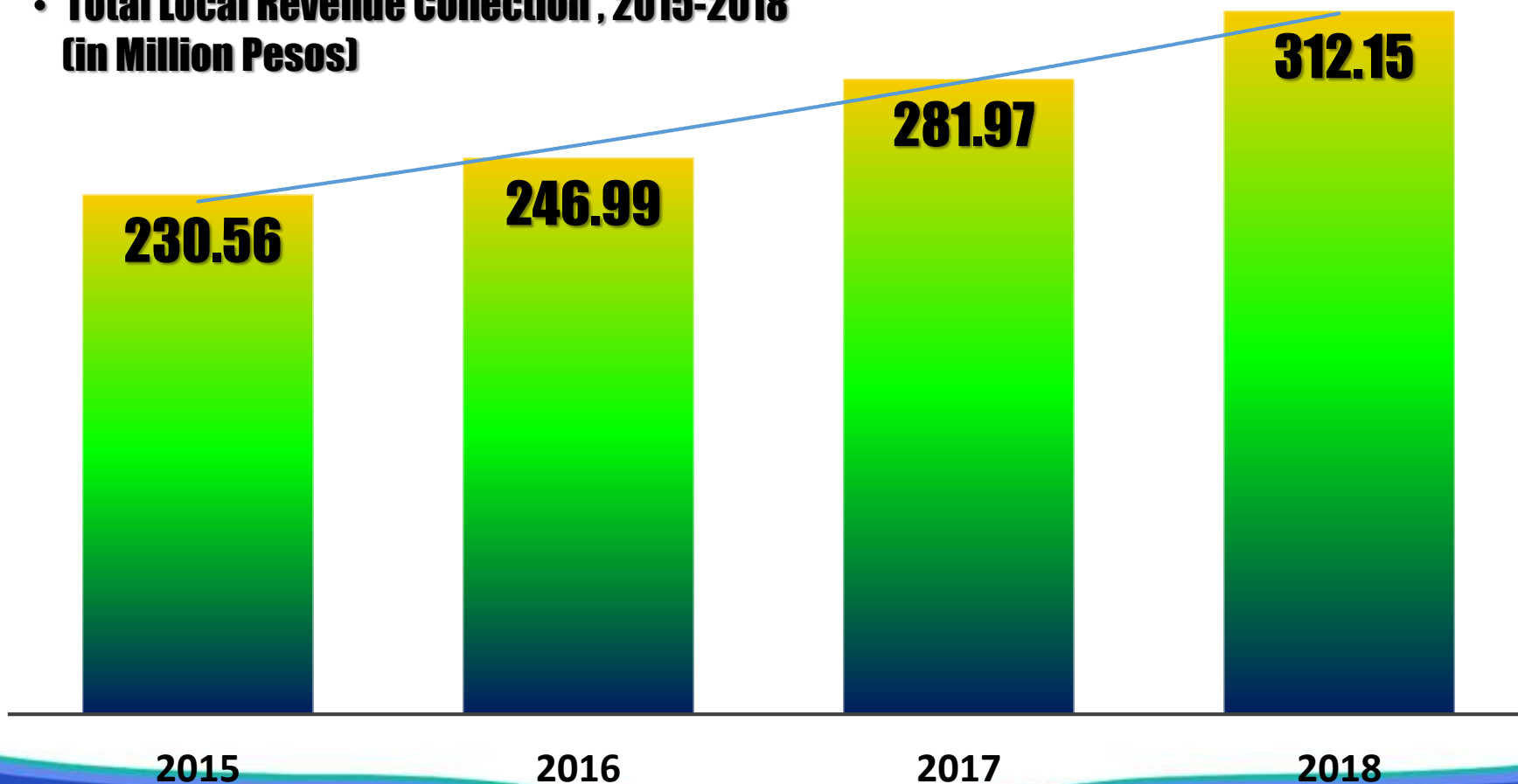

(in Million Pesos)**

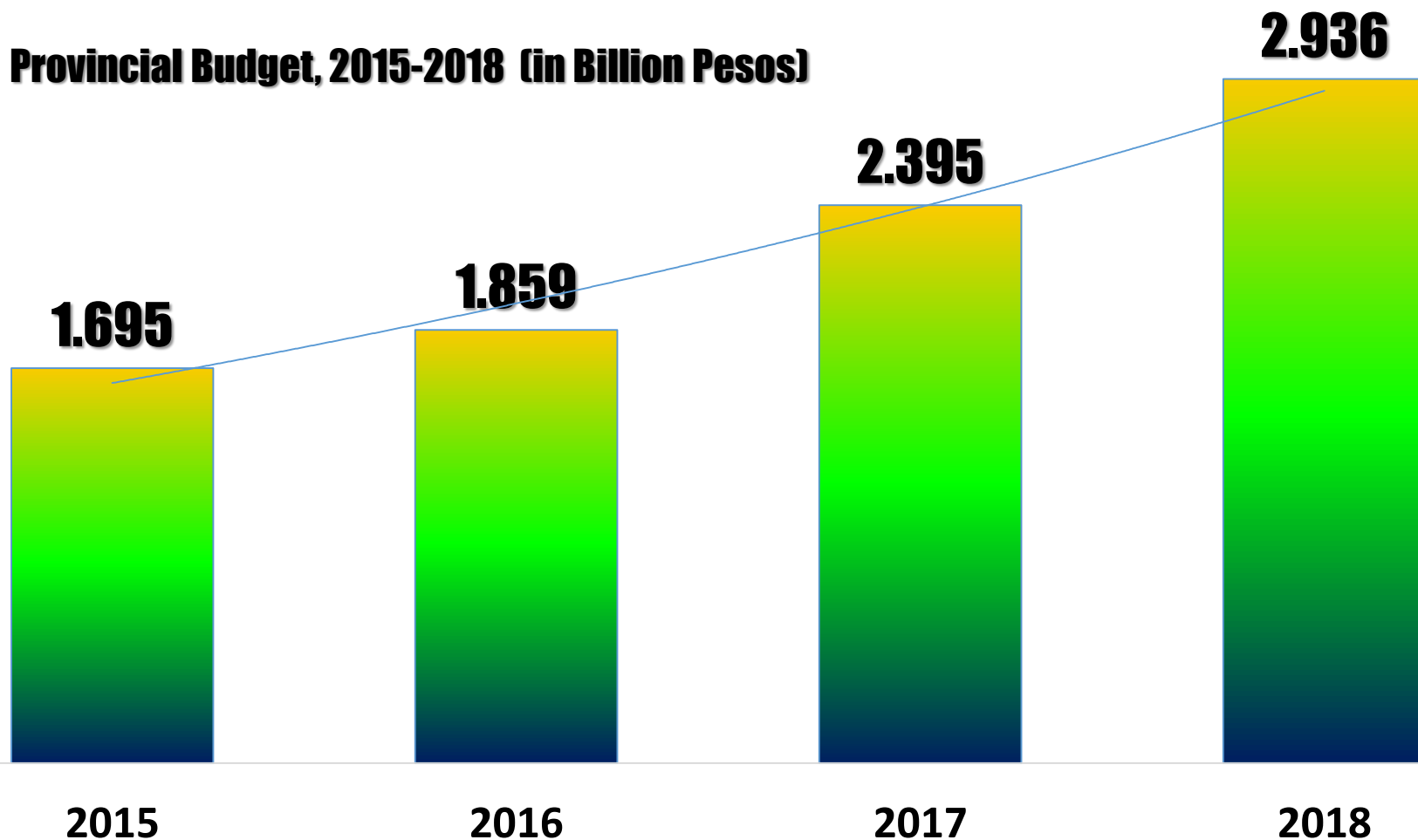

- Provincial Budget, 2015-2018 (in Billion Pesos)



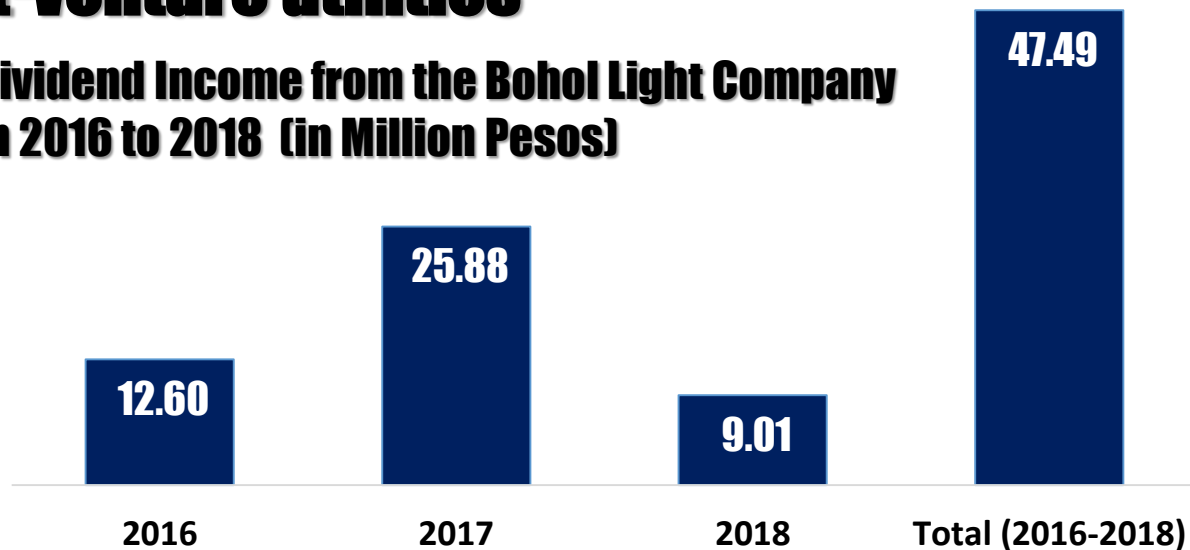

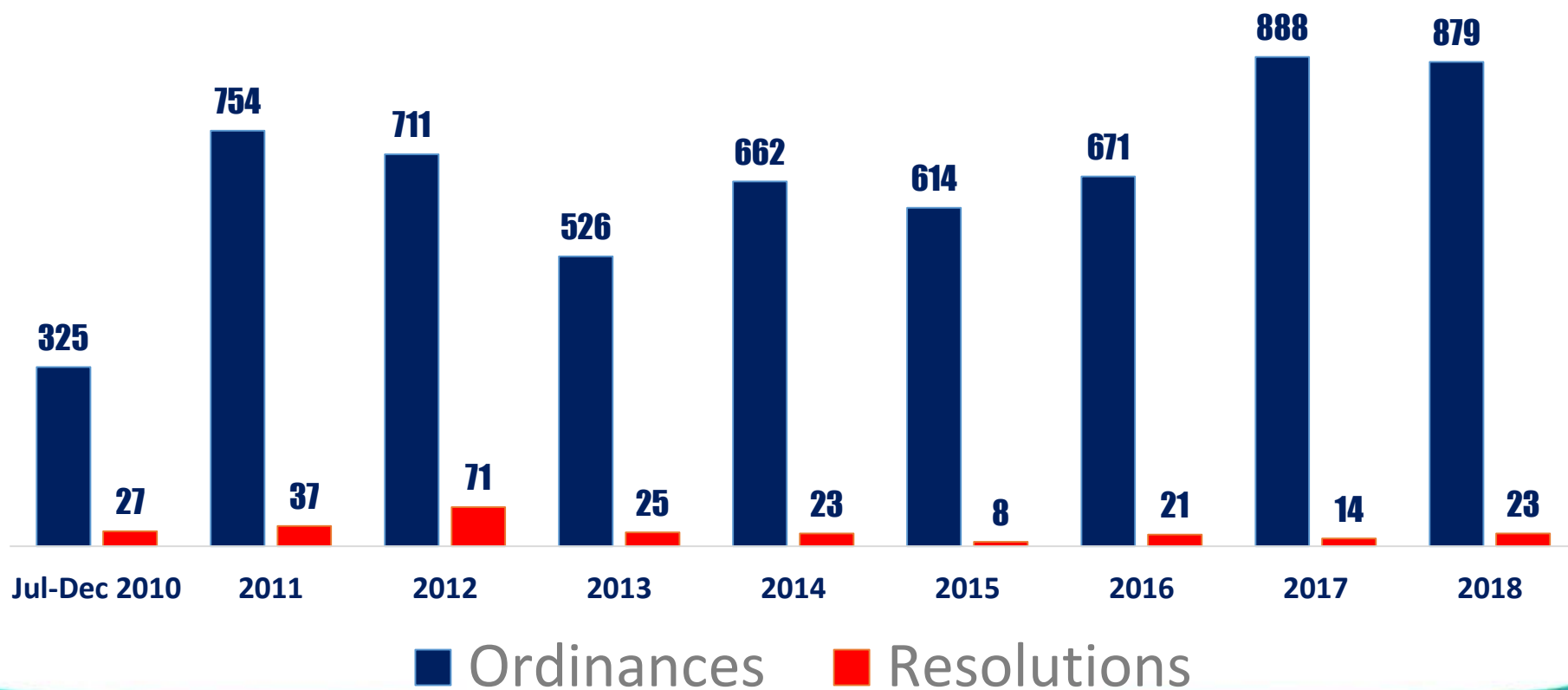

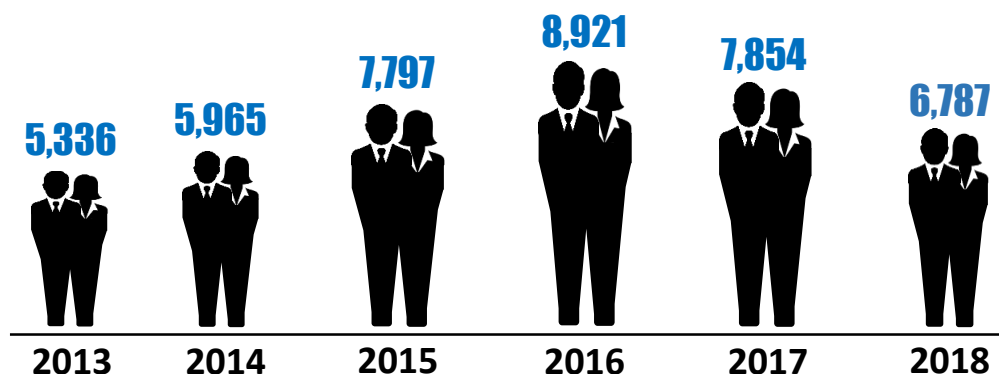

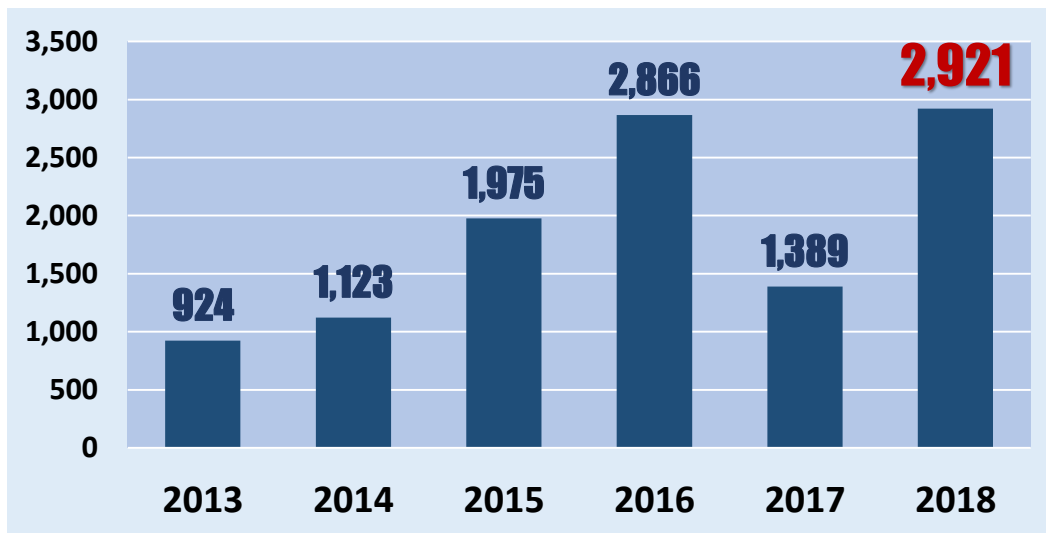

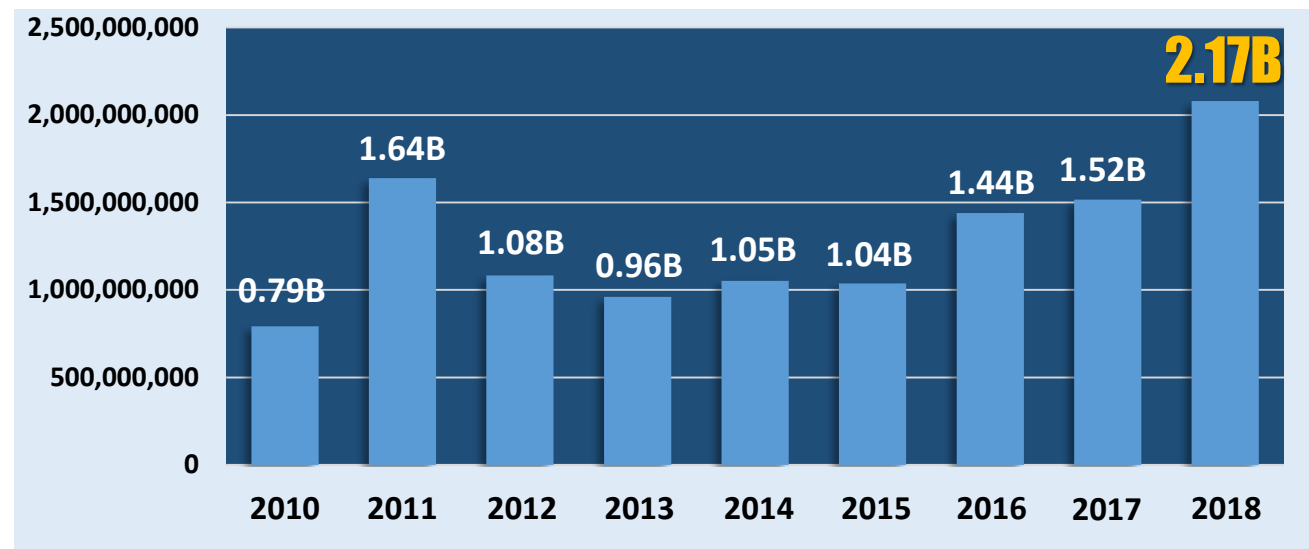

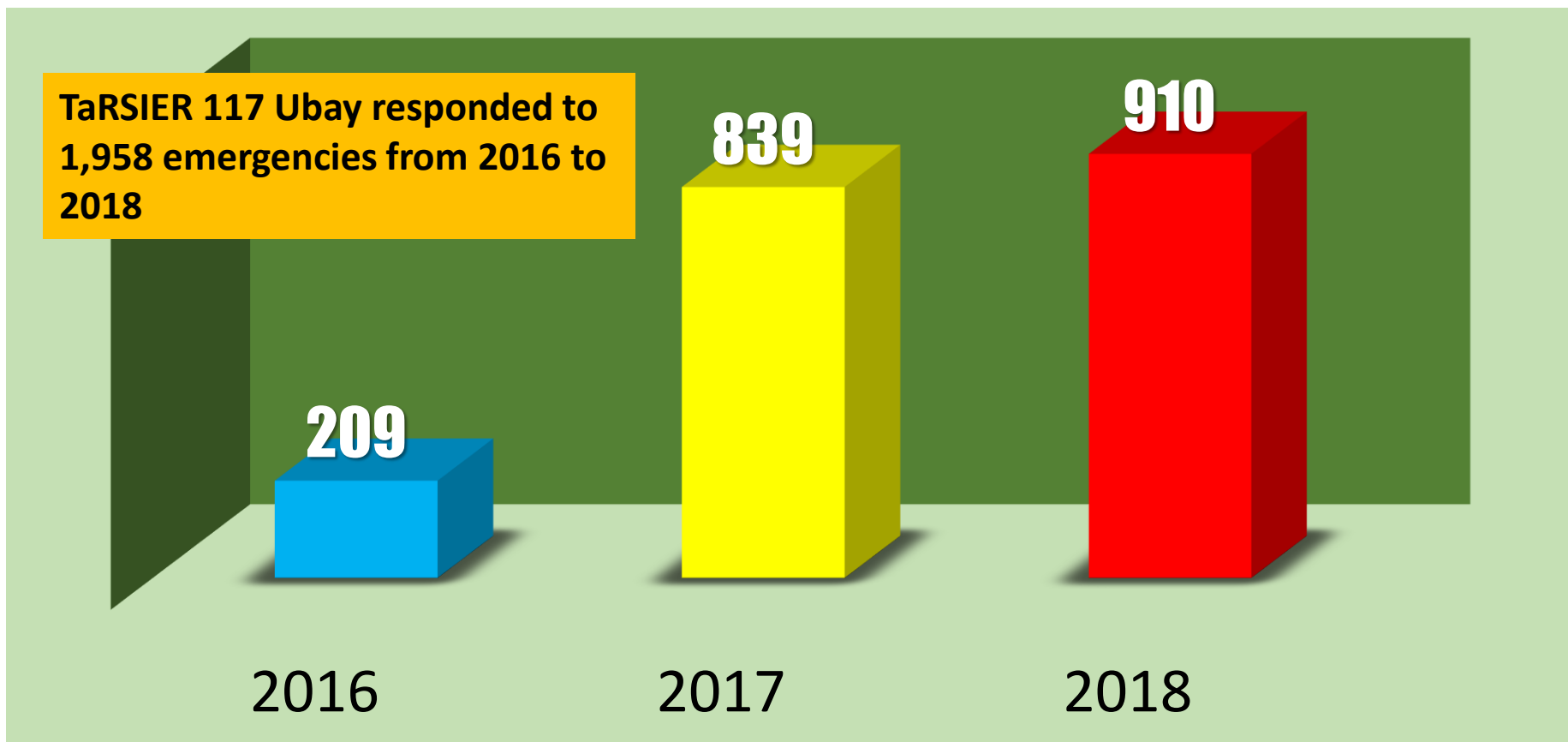

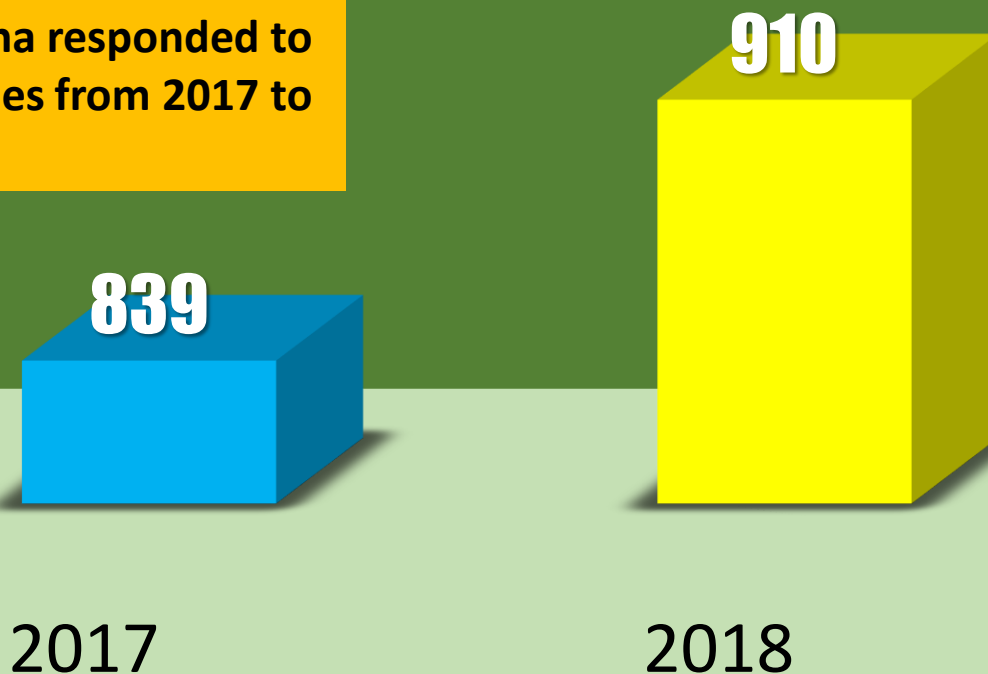

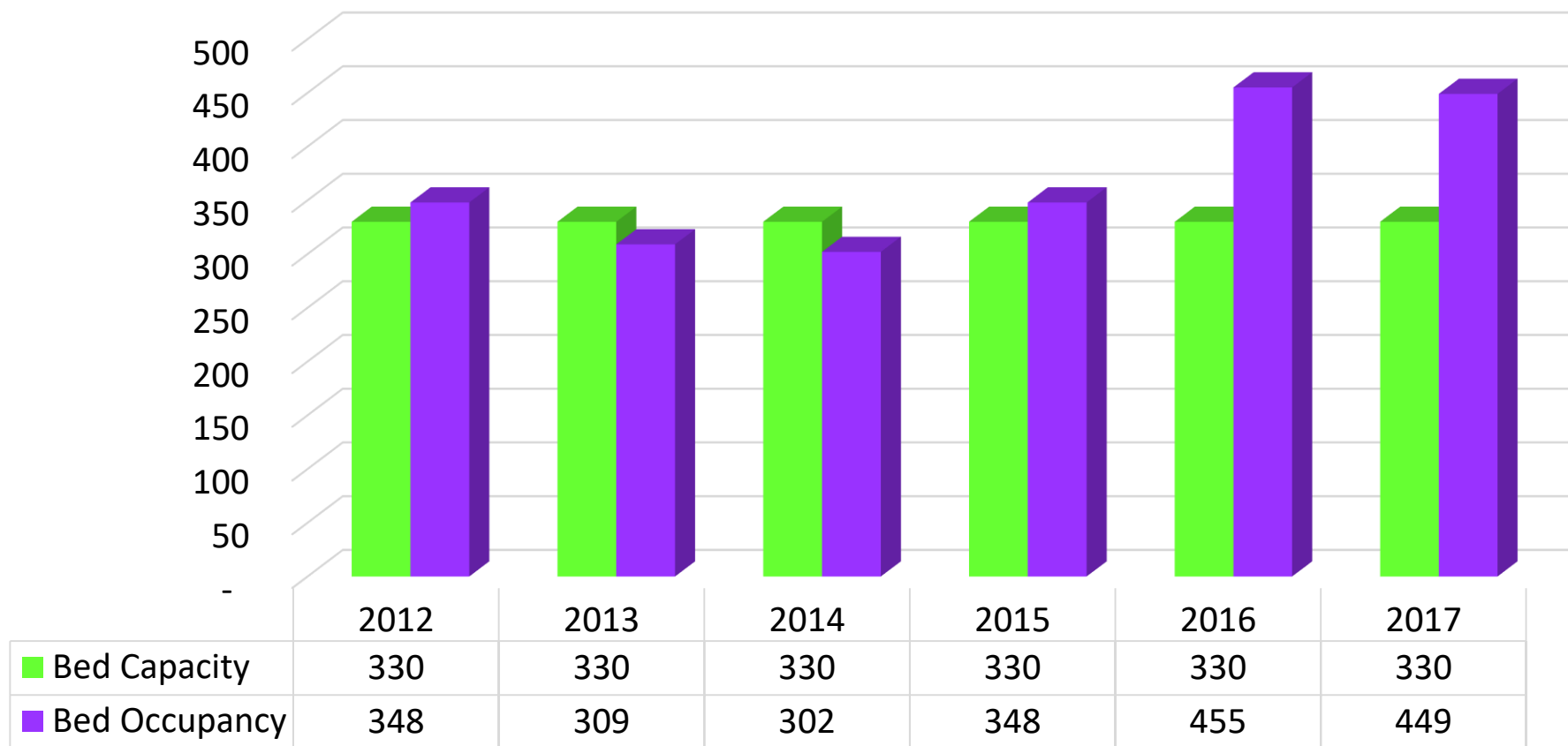

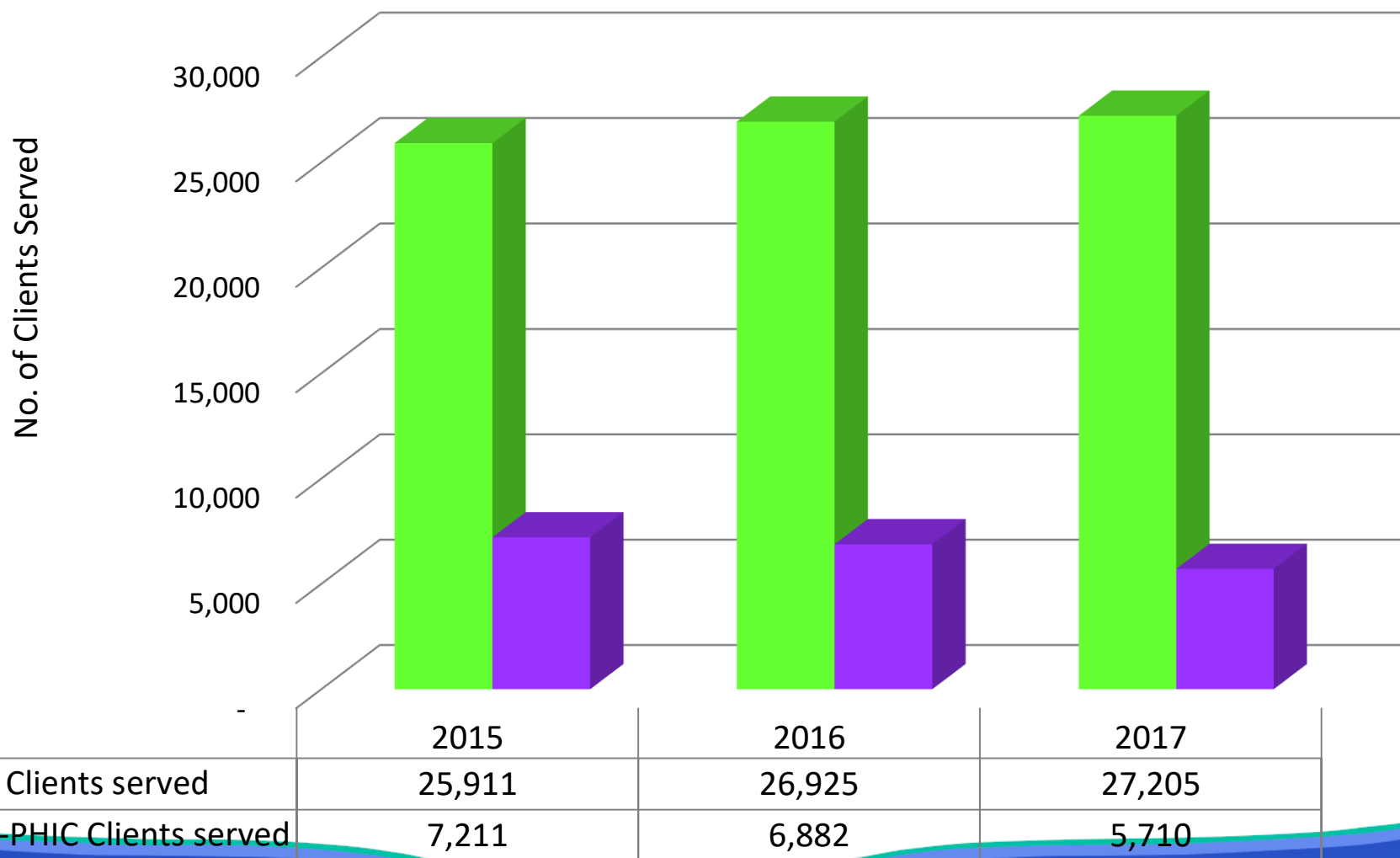
Bed Capacity vs. Bed Occupancy from 2012-2017

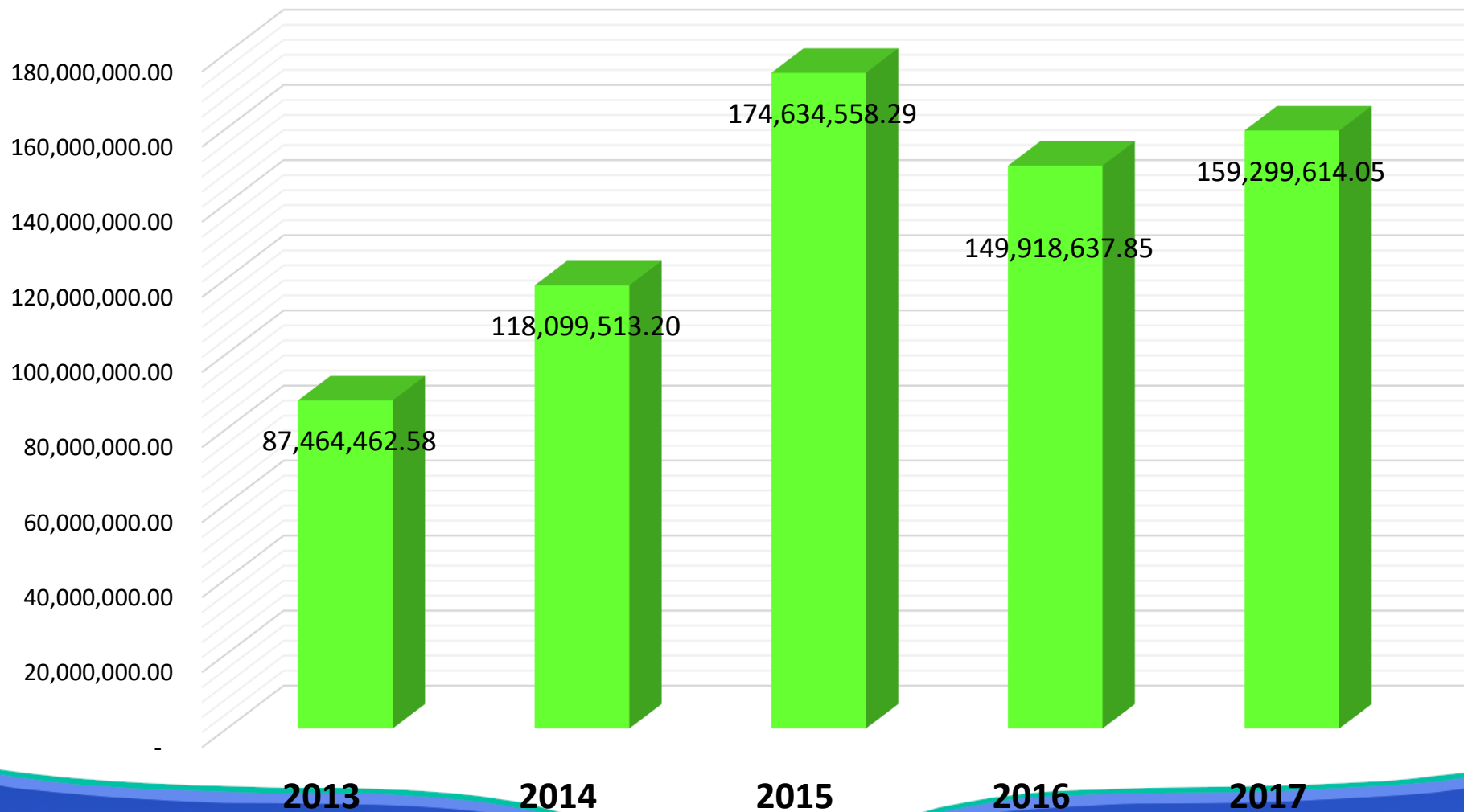

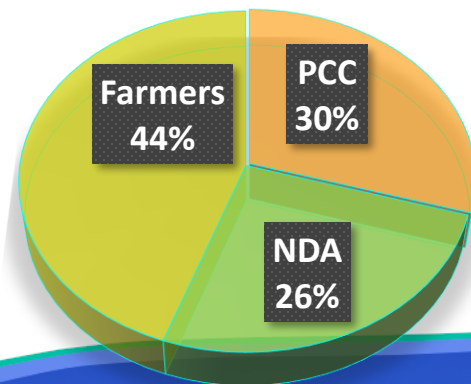
Raw Milk Production, Bohol: 2012-2018

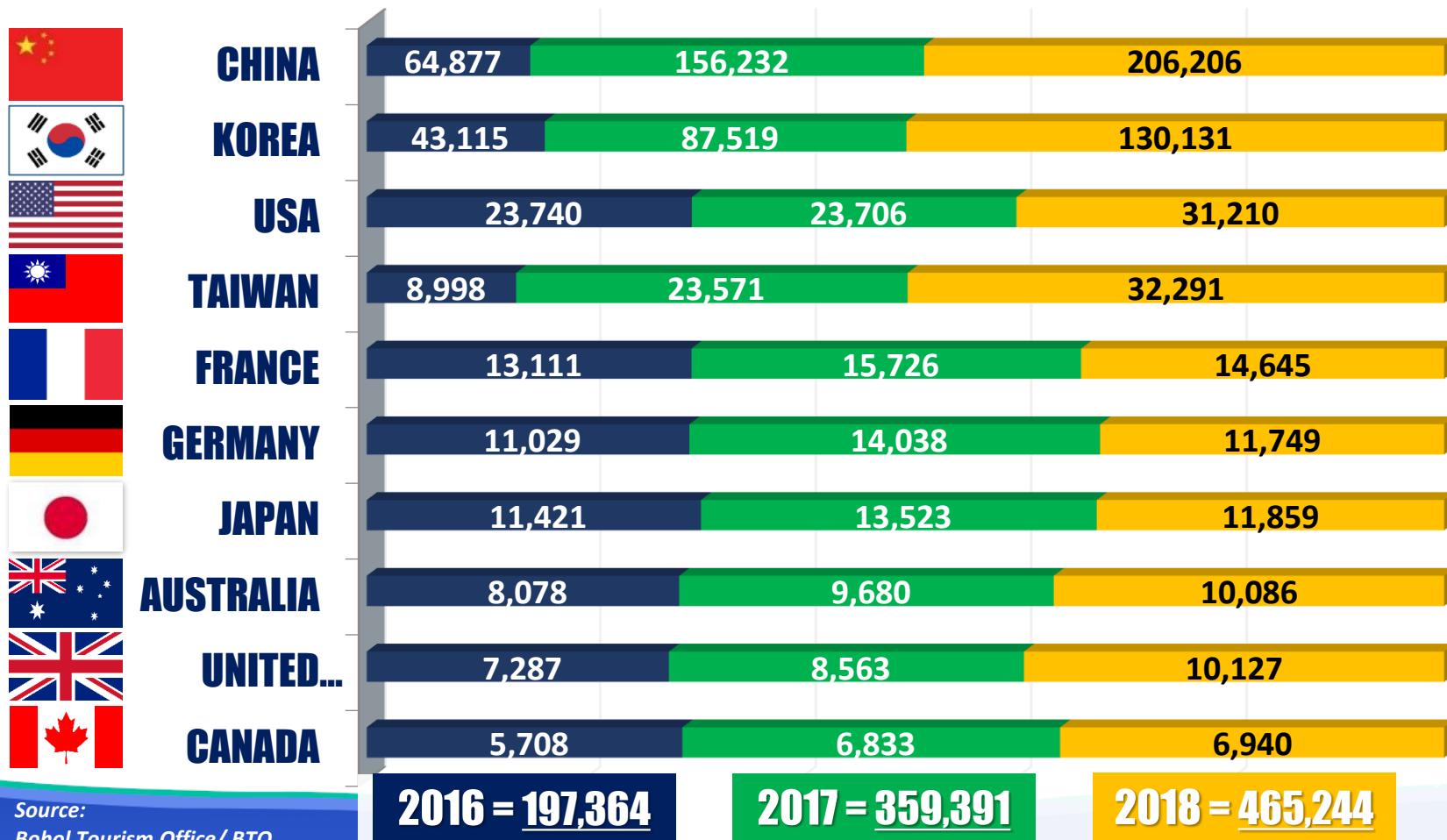

Managed by the DILG, LGPMS is a web-based, self-assessment tool that measures the performance of local government units (LGUs) in key governance areas. It assesses the performance of cities and provinces in administrative, social, economic and environmental governance. It also assesses local government units in terms of transparency, participation and financial accountability, the posts for good governance.

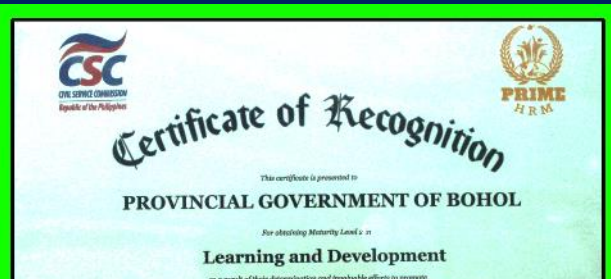

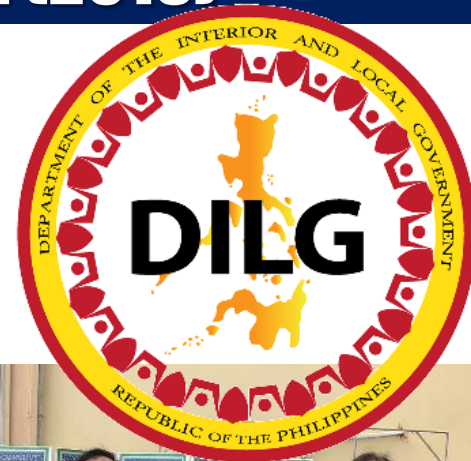


Proficiency Rating per HRM area
