GUIDELINES ON THE ENTRY OF LIVE POULTRY, CAPTURED WILD (ORNAMENTAL) BIRDS, NON-POULTRY, POULTRY PRODUCTS AND BY PRODUCTS INTO THE PROVINCE OF BOHOL

Whereas, on February 22, 2022, the Department of Agriculture through the Bureau of Animal Industry - Animal Disease Diagnosis and Reference Leboratory (BAF-ADDRL) conducted a test of affected birds to ducks and quail farms in the provinces of Bulacan and Pampanga using the Real Time-Polymerate Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) wherein the sald bird samples were found to be positive of the Highly Pathogenic Avain Influenza (HPAI) subtype HDMI strain commonly known as Bird Filu:

Whereas, on February 22, 2022, the Department of Agriculture through the Durcou of Animal Industry - Animal Disease Diagnosis and Reference Laboratory (BAI-ADDRL), conducted a test of affected birds to ducks and qualifarms in the provinces of Bulacan and Pampanga using the Real Time-Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) wherein the said bird samples were found to be positive of the Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI) subtype ISN11 strain commonly known as Bird Flu;

Whereas, the confirmatory test of the BAI-ADDRL was officially reported to the World Organization of Animal Health (OIE) in accordance with Chapter 10.4 of the OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code:

Whereas, Avian Influenza or Bird Flu is a highly contagious viral disease caused by any Influenza A virus affecting all birds and poultry;

Whereas, Avian Influenza cases are confirmed in the provinces of Benguet, Dataan, Dulacan, Nueva Ecija, Pampanga, Laguna and Camarines Sur in Luzon and South Cotabato, Maguindanao, Sultan Kudarat, and North Cotabato in Mindanao while some provinces are currently under surveillance and testing:

Whereas, on June 30, 2022, the Undersigned Issued Executive Order No. 05, series of 2022 providing for the guidelines on the entry of live poultry, captured wild (ornamental) birds, non-poultry.

ESTABLISHING A CANINE UNIT UNDER THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, it is universally recognized that the use of trained canines and their handlers is vital in law enforcement against illegal drugs and terrorism, criminal activities, disaster response, and other initiatives to promote the general welfare and protect public health and safety;

WHEREAS, recently, a big number of illegal drugs have been intercepted by police authorities in, or in transit to, the province and a lot more could be detected if drug-sniffing dogs are stationed at ports of entry and other strategic places;

WHEREAS, invoking the General Welfare Clause of the Local Government Code of 1991 (Section 16 of R.A. 7160) and other related laws, and to be more effective and efficient in the fight against criminal activities, there is a need to establish a canine unit under the Office of the Governor.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ERICO ARISTOTLE C. AUMENTADO, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me as Governor of Bohol, do hereby Order:

Section 1. Creation. The Canine Unit is hereby created under the Office of the Governor.

Section 2. Supervision. The Canine Unit shall be under the direct supervision of the Executive Assistant for Peace and Order, Public Safety, and Security (POPSS), Office of the Governor.

MANDATING ALL MOTOR VEHICLES ENTERING THE PROVINCE OF BOHOL THROUGH THE SEA PORTS TO UNDERGO INSPECTION BY THE CANINE UNIT, OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, Section 16 of R.A. 7160, the Local Government Code of 1991, empowers the local government units to initiate actions that will redound to the general welfare; and the responsibilities given to the Governor under the same law includes the maintenance of peace and order and ensuring the faithful implementation of the law;

WHEREAS, the proliferation of illegal drugs continues to plague the Province of Bohol despite the gallant efforts of the law enforcement agencies in the province;

WHEREAS, according to police intelligence reports, one of the ways illegal drugs enter the province is they are transported by persons or loaded on motor vehicles on board roll-on-roll-off sea vessels or such other types of sea vessels capable of transporting motor vehicles;

WHEREAS, an accepted and proven measure to curb the spread of illegal drugs is the deployment of trained canines to sniff out these narcotics and apprehend the persons in possession thereof;

WHEREAS, the Canine Unit under the Office of the Governor, Province of Bohol, consisting of handlers and trained canines, has been established by virtue of Executive Order No. 4 s. 2023, dated February 14, 2023, not only in pursuance of the continuing fight against illegal drugs, but also to fight terrorism and other criminal activities, as well as for disaster response and other initiatives to promote the general welfare, protect public health and safety;

WHEREAS, it is necessary that the said Canine Unit be deployed at any given time at the sea ports in the province in order to check if any of the unloaded motor vehicles entering the province are carrying any illegal drugs.




